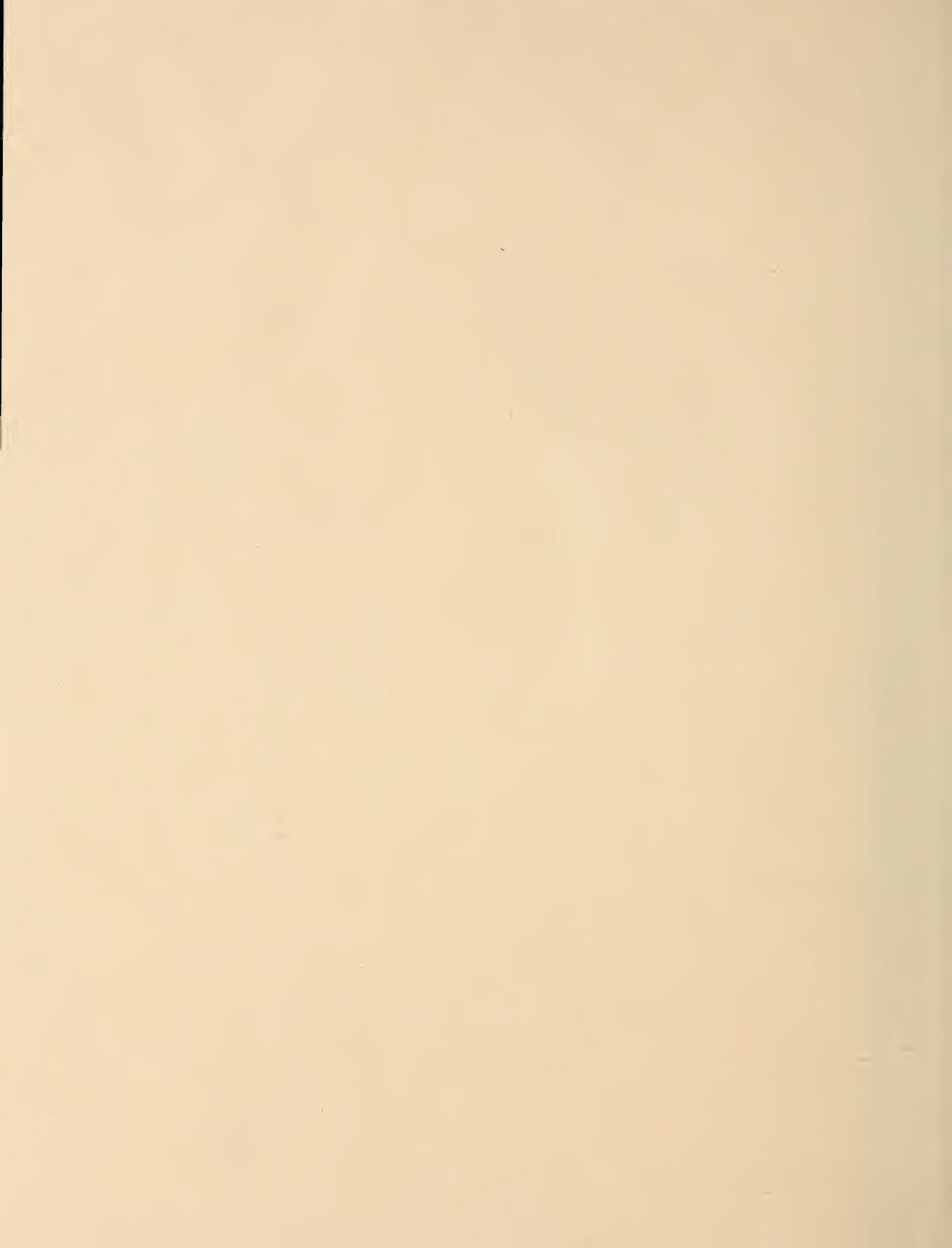

The USDA Forest Service is cooperating with State employment offices for recruitment, screening, and referral of applicants for field-going, temporary positions.

How To Apply for a Job

For National Forests

Local Area Applicants Individuals interested in applying for field-going, temporary positions at a National Forest or Research Station in the area in which they live should contact their local State employment office to obtain information about positions and how to apply for them.

Out-of-Area Applicants Individuals interested in applying for positions outside the area in which they live should contact the National Forest or Research Station they are interested in to obtain specific employment information for that unit and information about which State employment office to contact for making application. In addition, applicants are encouraged to visit their local State employment office to review job listings in the Interstate Job Bank System. The Interstate Job Bank System is a national system used by State employment offices to publicize job vacancies beyond the local area. It is usually used when suitable applicants are not available in the area where the job is located.
