# **Recruiting Temporary Forest Service Employees Through State Employment Offices**

he USDA Forest Service is cooperating with State employment offices for recruitment, screening, and referral of applicants for field-going, temporary positions.

## How To Apply for a Job

## **Local Area Applicants**

Individuals interested in applying for fieldgoing, temporary positions at a National Forest or Research Station in the area in which

they live should contact their local State employment office to obtain information about positions and how to apply for them.

# **Applicants**

Out-of-Area Individuals interested in applying for positions outside the area in which they live should contact the National Forest or Re-

search Station they are interested in to obtain specific employment information for that unit and information about which State employment office to contact for making application. In addition, applicants are encouraged to visit their local State employment office to review job listings in the Interstate Job Bank System. The Interstate Job Bank System is a national system used by State employment offices to publicize job vacancies beyond the local area. It is usually used when suitable applicants are not available in the area where the job is located.

Since candidates are referred to positions as job orders are received by the servicing State employment offices, there are no specific application deadlines. It is anticipated, however, that a majority of positions will be filled during the months of March, April, May, and June.

All applicants must be citizens of the United States and for most positions must be at least 18 years of age at the time they are available for work.
