WARRANTY. We warrant that all Seeds sold by us shall prove to be as represented, to this extent, that should they prove otherwise, we will replace them, or send other seeds to the same value.

But we cannot guarantee the crop any further than the above offer, as there are so many causes over which we have no control, which operate unfavorably in the germination of seeds and maturity of the crop. Among the causes of failure may be mentioned unfavorable weather, which is one of the most important. The soil may be in proper condition when the seeds are planted, but the weather which follows may be cold and wet, which will cause the seeds to rot; or it may be hot and dry, which destroys the germ before it shows itself. The seeds may be, and are frequently, destroyed by vermin of various kinds. Such occurences are beyond the power of man to prevent, and for them we cannot be responsible. We wish it understood, therefore, that while we exercise the greatest care to have all seeds pure and reliable, we do not give any warranty, expressed or implied, further than above stated. If the purchaser does not accept the seeds on these terms and conditions, they must be returned at once, and the money that has been paid for them will be refunded.
