HYDRANGEA (Paniculata Grandiflora)	15 to 18 inches	40¢
Flowers large and showy. First white, then pink, then reddish bronze and green. August until Autumn.		
ROSA RUGOSA	15 to 18 inches	40¢
Valuable, hardy type. Foliage lustrous dark green. Red flowers in clusters succeeded by persistent fruits.		
SPIREA VAN HOUTTEI	2 to 3 feet	50¢
Grandest of all Spireas. A complete fountain of pure white in May and June.		
SYRINGA (Persian Lilac)	2 to 3 feet	50¢
Small foliage. Bright, delicate, purple flowers
