## STRAWBERRY PLANTS

All of our pot-grown plants are strong and well rooted, being grown in two and one-half inch pots, and are shipped in the pots in which they are grown, thereby insuring safe shipment, the roots undisturbed, allowing them to be transplanted to the best advantage.
Pot-gromn Strawberry Plants are usually ready for delivery after August 1st.
Strawberries when planted during August or September produce a fine growth during the fall and insure a good crop the following Summer.
"DE LUE'S JUDITH." (New).
This new early seedling was awarded the Silver Medal by the Mass. Horticultural Society in 1915 and three first prizes in open competition at the annual show of the same society in 1917.
The "DeLue's Judith" is a perfect blossom variety.
It is very large and carries its size well throughout the whole season, making it one of the most valuable for the home garden. The color is deep red all through and quite glossy. It is of good form and has no superior for flavor; is very smooth in texture and without core. Its firmness and fine appearance makes it a fine shipping berry for market gardeners. ## FALL OR EVERBEARING VARIETIES

Everbearing strawberries are now extensively grown both for home use and for market. They bear fruit steadily from early June until December. To get a large crop during the latter part of summer and in the fall, the blossoms should be picked off until about July 1st.

PEERLESS. This variety is considered to be the best everbearing sort yet raised. The fruit is rich in color and sweet in flavor, of good size and form.

PROGRESSIVE. A very choice everbearing sort with plants similar to the Dunlap, being strong, healthy and very hardy and a good plant maker. 'The, Yrogressive is one of the most perpetual, producing good berries of medium size, dark red inside and out.

SUPERB. The fruit of this excellent variety is very large, glossy dark red color, particularly firm and choice quality. The berries are of exceedingly uniform size and shape and a rich blood red from outside to centre.

## STRAWBERRY PLANTS

ABINGTON. (Midseason.) A strong growing native variety of recent introduction. The fruit is of large size, bright red in color, very solid and of excellent flavor.

AROBINE. A new Berry - and one with all the good qualities required to suit both the home and marketgrowers; medium large in size; very free in flower and fruit; excellent color and form; flavor unsurpassed.

BARRYMORE. This fine strawberry was awarded a Silver Medal by the Massachusetts Horticultural Society in 1908, for its excellence. The plants are of strong growth and very productive. The conical shaped berries are of medium size and of a dark, glossy, crimson color; the flesh is a rich red and very juicy.

BELMONT. (Late.) One of the standard varieties and always reliable, and without exception the berry whose flavor has not been excelled. Fruit is of medium size, firm and heavy; the color a deep, rich red, shading light at the centre. As to its keeping qualities it is without doubt the best.

BRANDXWINE. (Midseason.) A strong growing mercial growers for its quality as a shipper. Color blood red; round; yields very large crops of finest quality berries.

CHESAPEAKE. Plants large and vigorous with deep green foliage. Fruit large deep red in color and of a rich aromatic flavor.

COMMONWEALTH. (Late.) A berry of Massachusetts origin and one which has a long fruiting season; it is probably as large as any berry at the present time and fully as productive. Its color is that dark crimson so much admired and unexcelled for its fine flavor.

EXCELSIOR. (Extra Early.) One of the earliest berries in existence; unusually productive owing to its early fruiting season. The fruit is of round, conical form, of fair size and excellent flavor. The color a dark red and glossy, holding nearly to the center.

HIAWATHA. A late variety, ripening about the same time as the Commonwealth which it closely resembles in size and firmness, but of a better color and flavor. A variety adaptable to most soils.

GLEN MARY. (Midsummer.) An excellent berry for quality, large size and productiveness, and one that meets all requirements for home and market use. Usually the last berries picked are as large as the first. The color which is a deep glossy crimson is very attractive; the fruit is firm and solid and of excellent flavor.

GOLDEN GATE. (Midseason.) This variety is a particularly strong grower, producing large, strong blossoms, making an exceptional sort for planting with the pistillate sorts for pollenizing. Fruit is a rich crimson, rarely showing fruit with green tips.

MARSHALL. (Midseason.) Undoubtedly the best strawberry for home use and one of the best as an exhibition berry, usually taking a prize wherever exhibited. The color is one greatly admired, being a rich, glossy crinison, With this deep color running nearly to the center.

NEW YORK. One of the best sorts for private or market gardens. The berries are large, of conical form; dark red color, firm texture and of remarkably sweet flavor. In the market they sell at sight.

ROOSEVELT. A midseason variety. Habit vigorous and strong. Fruit is much larger than Marshall, but similar in shape. color being a somewhat lighter crimson.

SENATOR DUNLAP. (Midseason.) Is one of the universally popular varieties; famous as a s历ipper. Color dark red; top-shaped; fruit large, rich flavor.

WILLIAM BELT. A luxuriant grower. Healthy and hardy, long and conical in shape, color deep red all through. An excellent variety for private growers. A good keeper and shipper; the flesh being firm and solid to the core.

## HOUSE OR ROOM GARDENING

When our materials are used the following hints on cultivation should be followed: Sprinkle fibre, which should be thoroughly moistened, over the bottom of the bowl to a depth of $11 / 2$ inches, carefully place the bulbs upon the fibre, taking care that they do not touch each other, then fill up the bowl with fibre. Although it is desirable that the fibre should be all around the bulbs, it must not be packed too tightly, and must cover the top of the bulbs.

Start the bulbs into growth by thoroughly saturating the fibre with water, drain off and keep moist; then place the bowl in an airy room or shelf in a subdued light. When the young growth pierces the fibre, the balbs may be placed on a table near a window or some other light place to mature their growth and come into flower.
