OUR GUARANTEE:—We deliver Chrysanthemum rooted cuttings or transplanted cuttings by parcel post prepaid up to the 6th zone or 1400 miles from Geneva and guarantee safe delivery. Stock not satisfactory when received may be returned at once and money refunded, or slight difficulties will be adjusted and you keep the stock. Outside this territory stock travels at buyers risk and expense.

To the Trade:

If you have used our stock before you already know the quality we ship. If you want to see what the stock is this season we will gladly send you a sample for 25c postage. If you have placed an advance order we will gladly send sample without charge if requested.

When you consider free delivery and our Guarantee our prices are very low but not so low that we sacrifice quality in any way. Our cuttings are not as large as some growers ship and we grow them small intentionally because a small soft cutting will give much better satisfaction than a large hard one. Repeat orders year after year from large growers is sufficient guarantee to the quality. Some growers order months ahead to be sure and have what they want. If you have never used our stock a trial order will convince you.

TRANSPLANTED CUTTINGS

MIDGE

Fume Tobac will control Midge and is very easy to handle. It may be had from most supply houses or direct from the Uniform Products Company, Inc., 111 Fifth Ave., New York. The company furnishes tins for hanging in the house for burning the powder, and for our use we consider this the most practical of anything we have found to control Midge. We also sometimes have to spray with NICOFUME LIQUID and sometimes we use CYANOGAS, both of which are good but not so pleasant to handle as the Fume Tobac.

You need not fear Midge if you use preventatives. Our stock is clean and we keep it clean.

SNAPDRAGON

Follow your Mums with Snaps. Now that Rust can be completely controlled many find this a very paying crop. Snaps and Mums are the only wholesale crops we grow and by putting all our energies and thought into these two crops we think we can give you as good or better service than you can get elsewhere. We try to treat our customers as we would want them to treat us if we were buying and we will expect to supply you regularly. Our Rust circular is free.

FERTILIZER

As to fertilizer for Mums, we have tried many kinds with varied degrees of success but have found Smith's Mum Manure has given us the best satisfaction. This is made by the Independent Mfg. Co. of Philadelphia, Pa., and costs \$70.00 per ton. We used ½ lb. per bushel of soil—or about that—and a top dressing later.

Also, for a liquid Chemical Fertilizer, Chrysaline, prepared by Elmer D. Smith & Co., of Adrian, Mich., will give excellent results. This is a complete fertilizer made especially for Chrysanthemums.
