## CULTURAL SUGGESTIONS

The gladiolus is easy to grow. It will do well in almost any garden soil but a rich sandy loam is best.

Planting may be done any time after February 1st along the coast of California, Oregon or Washington and at intervals during the spring and summer as late as September. In the interior and in the east plantings may be made as early as danger of frost is past.

The depth to plant is largely dependent on the size of the bulb and the location. Three inches for small bulbs, up to five or six inches for large ones is usually the rule.

Water frecly; don't just sprinkle, but give a good soaking when watering, then shallow cultivation to keep down the weeds and prevent the soil from crusting. Do not cultivate deep next to the bulbs as the small side roots will be cut if this is done.

Fertilize with some good complete fertilizer after the bulbs are up and again when the fifth leaf has formed, followed by copious watering to make the fertilizer available.

Dig the bulbs when the leaves are about two-thirds brown. Cut off the stem immediately close to the bulb, spread them out to dry, preferabiy outdoors where the sun and wind will soon cure them. (Shade if placed in the sun to prevent sunburn.)

After a couple of weeks they will be cured enough to remove the old bulb after which store in a cocl dry place, preferably in screen bottom trays or boxes. Keep away from heat and dampness and guard against freezing if necessary.

Label all named varieties and make a record of planting for identification. When digging be sure to put the label in the tray before any bulbs are deposited to avoid mixing.

For a bouquet cut when first two florets open and take indoors, placing in water. Every morning cut off the stem and change the water. This will insure freshness until the last floret has opened.
