Each of the varieties listed on the next four pages is priced at one dollar per tuber. All varieties are guaranteed to grow when given ordinary care. Customers having open accounts may remit on May 15th, the approximate date of delivery.

ALEONORA (Inc.C)

Giant cactus of dark lavender. In Europe, it was called the nearest to blue of any dahlia ever grown; but here it is a dark pink lavender. Extra good on erect stems.

ALICE GREEN (F.Dec.)

Dark yellow flower of the largest size. Foliage is heavy dark green. Very popular with everyone that has grown it. Worth trying out.

BARTON'S CHOICE (F.Dec.)

Purple-lavender shaded with yellow. Low plants with dark green crinkly foliage. Medium late.

BLOOD AND SAND (F.Dec.)

The name describes the color. Dark green foliage. Large blooms that are early. A 1931 introduction.

BUTTERCUP (F.Dec.)

Heavy strong foliage; immense massive blooms; extra free bloomer. Stem is slightly pendant. Best yellow I have ever grown.

CLANSMAN (F.Dec.)

Apricot orange, centre darkening to jasper pink; radiating a golden sheen that attracts the eye from afar.

DOLLAR DAHLIAS

DIGNITY (F.Dec.)

Heavy massive flower. Plants low; covered with blooms. Early. Color old-gold with reddish reverse which shows on face of the flower. One of the best varieties.

DR. JOHN CARMAN (F.Dec.)

Extra large flower on low bush. Dark red, with outside petals much lighter. Very similar to Robert Treat but much larger. Very early.

ELIZA CLARK BULL (F.Dec.)

Large pure white of perfect formation. Medium early. Does better in partial shade as sun burns the bush during hot dry weather.

FORT MONMOUTH (I.Dec.)

Immense flower of semi-cactus formation. Crimson maroon suffused with wine red. Tall grower with dark green foliage. Medium bloomer.

FORT WASHINGTON (F.Dec.)

Extra tall; medium early. Immense flowers of deep maroon. Fine.

IDA PERKINS (F.Dec.)

Best white I have ever grown. Large flower on good stem. Blooms early and stands the hot dry weather.

JACK DE MARS (F.Dec.)

Low plant with large blooms. Dark yellow with center petals shaded brick-red. This variety is one of the best but little known.

DOLLAR DAHLIAS

LA KIB (F. Dec.)

Short stocky plants with very large clear yellow blooms. Some flowers carry one or more pure white petals. Early and good.

LILAC GLORY (Inc.Cac.)

Pure lilac. It is a strong grower and has large blooms. One of the best from Belgium. Early. An Honor Roll variety.

MADAM G. BAEYENS (F. Doc.)

A Belgium variety with good stem. Large yellow flowers over-laid with pink. Late bloomer.

MADAM GASTON BARBANSON (F.Dec.)

Large decorative with broad petals. Color is entirely new; bronze veined and dotted salmon. Good for exhibition or for cutting. Belgium.

NEW CANAAN GLORY (F.Dec.)

Old gold striped darker; tall grower. Early. An extra attractive variety that shows up above all the rest.

PRESIDENT ALBERT KREGLINGER Dec.

Large flower. rigid stem and free blooming. Color is very delicate satiny lilac rose. Late. Certificate of Merit from the National Dahlia Society of Belgium 1928.

QUEEN OF THE GARDEN BEAUTIFUL

Very large bloom of primrose yellow. Very free bloomer; medium late. A good one for "Largest Bloom" Class.

DOLLAR DAHLIAS

RADIO (I.Dec.)

Combination of blood red tipped and edged with yellow. Immense flowers that are held erect on rigid stems. Medium early.

ROSE FALLON (F.Dec.)

Dark orange tinted amber and salmon. Tall. Needs care and attention but pays for itself in massive flowers. Very best strain of stock.

SANHICAN'S BLUEBIRD (F.Dec.)

Beautiful light violet blue, a very odd color. Deep flower that is very popular. Good stem.

SANTA ANNA (Si.Cac.)

Beautiful salmon-rose suffused with gold. Large flower on good stem. Tall plants medium early.

SILVERADO (Inc.Cac.)

Large feathery bloom of white shaded silvery-lavender borne on strong stems. Very late and must be planted early in this locality.

SOVIET (F.Dec.)

A red that is as red as the Soviet flag. Good size and habits. Excellent stem; early. New in 1932.

THE WORLD (F.Dec.)

Rosy magenta overlaid with garnet, with silvery reverse and on edge of petals. Large flowers with full centres. Low plant; medium early.

The following dahlias are all priced at fifty cents per tuber.

ATLANTIC OCEAN (I.Dec.)

Clear yellow; a dahlia that can be grown to immense size. Medium late to bloom; light green foliage.

CHEMAR'S PURITY (F.Dec.)

White with an ivory centre that changes to white as the bloom opens. Good size and stem. Fuzzy foliage. Medium late.

C. P. R. (I.Dec.)

A blend of yellow, pink and white; reverse of petals reddish lavender which show on tips and in streaks. Tall grower; medium early.

FRANCIS LAROCCO (F.Dec.)

Very nice light yellow cut flower variety; large deep blooms; long stems; free bloomer and early. On the Honor Roll.

JANE COWL (I.Dec.)

Bronzy buff and old gold with darker centre. Erect flowers on erect stems. Very early and free bloomer. Ten inch flowers are common in the field. One variety that everyone will grow.

FIFTY CENT DAHLIAS

CHEERIO (I.Dec.)

Yellow tipped with white. Very handsome and different when taken care of. Very late bloomer
Light green foliage.

EDWIN H. HILLS (Si.Cac.)

Large deep flowers that are a combination of white and pink. Good stems; tall plants with dark green foliage. A beautiful flower.

ELLINOR VANDEVEER (F.Dec.)

Lavender pink, large bloom; extra fine long stem,

HARRY MAYER (F.Dec.)

Silver lavender with reverse of petals deep lavender. Low plant blooming early. Extra large flowers of perfect formation on short stems.

HERCULES (F.Dec.)

Tangerine with reverse of red. Deep flowers; good stem; high plant; blooming medium early.

JEAN D'ARC (F.Dec.)

Dark pink to buff, lighter reverse dashed with gold. Free on good stems. Nice for cut-flowers.

JERSEY SOVREIGN (F.Dec.)

Salmon orange. A vigorous grower with dark foliage. Flowers of good size and stem. Good for cut-flowers. A color that is different.

FIFTY CENT DAHLIAS

JUDGE MAREAN (F.Dec.)

Combination of salmon-pink, red orange, yellow and gold. First bloom overcast dark rose. Good size; very free and early. One of the best.

MABEL THATCHER (F.Dec.)

Good size; clear yellow; deep flower; early.

MARGARET W. WILSON (F.Dec.)

White and lavender pink. Low bush; early and an extra free bloomer. Good size and depth. Fine for garden decoration.

MADAM DIESNY (F.Dec.)

Deep mauve, strong flower of medium size; very free flowering on good stem. Good for cutting. This came from Europe and has done well both here and in Canada. Early.

NEGRO (I.Dec.)

Almost black. Very small and attractive.

ROYCROFT (Si.Cac.)

Cinnamon buff deepening to russet. Early and extra free. Low bushes that are covered with flowers. Fine for garden decoration. Dark green foliage.

FIFTY CENT DAHLIAS

SANHICAN'S MONARCH (F.Dec.)

Tyrian rose. Tall plants, late. Very showy

SAGAMORE (Si.Cac.)

Rich amber, shaded orange buff. Good size, fine form on strong stems. Extra good keeper.

THE PIRATE (F.Dec.)

Royal purple. Free bloomer; medium early and medium size. Low plant.

T. T. WHIPPLE (I.Dec.)

A variety originated by Mr. Norman Lamb, that has done well here. Color is lavender pink with lighter reverse and centre. Fine stem. Tall plants. Blooms from early until frost; keeps well when cut.
