## BEAUTIFUL HARDY LILIES

Are the most beautiful and stately of all flowers, produced from hardy buibs.

They are most showy and handsome when planted among shrubbery, or in the background of the hardy garden. Groups of 6 or more of a kind, here and there in such situations are most effective and a gorgeous display can be had by planting lilies in large beds.

The following lilies are some of the most hardy varieties, that are easy to grow in the average garden, and if properly planted, no more special attention will bc required than any other bulbous plants.

The essential requirements for best results are well prepared soil, perfect drainage, sufficient winter covering in the very cold sections, and an adequate supply of moisture during the growing and blooming season.

In early spring the top growth of the species Henryi, Regale and Speciosum should be protected from late frost. The orhers do not seems to be damaged by it.

Plant early this fall for best flowering results next summer.

Note-Due to an unusually early growing season, the lilies here are maturing early, and will be ready for delivery by September 15 th, except imported bulbs, which arrive in late October or early November.

AURATUM. The beautiful gold banded lily of Japan. Very large, fragrant flower 8 to 10 inches across, color ivory white, spotted crimson, with wide band of yellow through each petal.
