We will, however, replace or refund the original purchase price of any plants, shrubs or trees that are not labeled true to name, and will replace at half retail price any plants, shrubs, or trees, that fail to grow, provided these have been given reasonable care, and providing the original bill of sale has been paid in full and is presented.

Labor necessary for replacement charged at full price.

It is mutually agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that we will not be held for any greater amount than the original purchase price.

We do not warrant in any way, express or implied, the contents, or the description, purity, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds, bulbs, plants, or trees sold by us, and we will not in any way be responsible for the crop.

GENERAL PLANTING DIRECTIONS

Items to watch when transplanting

1. Always be sure and have the hole at least a third larger than the natural root spread.
2. In digging keep the good top soil in a separate pile from the hard subsoil. Place a layer of top soil in bottom of hole.
3. If ground is very dry fill hole half full of water and allow it to be absorbed before starting to plant.
4. See that the roots are spread out, and any long straggly ones are cut back, also a fresh clean diagonal cut to any bruised or broken ends, pressing cut surface down.
5. Work top soil in among roots and press down firmly so that no air pockets will remain, being careful not to injure roots by too much pressure.
6. Fill hole two-thirds full of soil then fill to top with water. Add enough water to be sure it has reached the roots. On ordinary sized bushes or roses at least five gallons of water is necessary, but the moisture condition of soil will affect quantity used.
7. If fertilizer is to be used add to top layer of soil.
8. When water has seeped down fill hole to top making sure the plant is in the center of the depression which will catch and hold the subsequent moisture.
9. If plants have been out of ground long, or if the weather at the time of planting is hot and dry it is a very good plan to draw a mound of soil eight to ten inches high about the plant until the growth is well started. When dirt is pulled away be sure that a depression is left for the plant so that it does not set higher than the ground around it and lose the natural moisture or surface water.
10. All plants must be pruned when planted. Different plants require varying degrees of cutting back. For definite directions on pruning inquire of salesman at time of purchase and he will gladly give instructions for definite plants, and prune plants for you at time of sale.

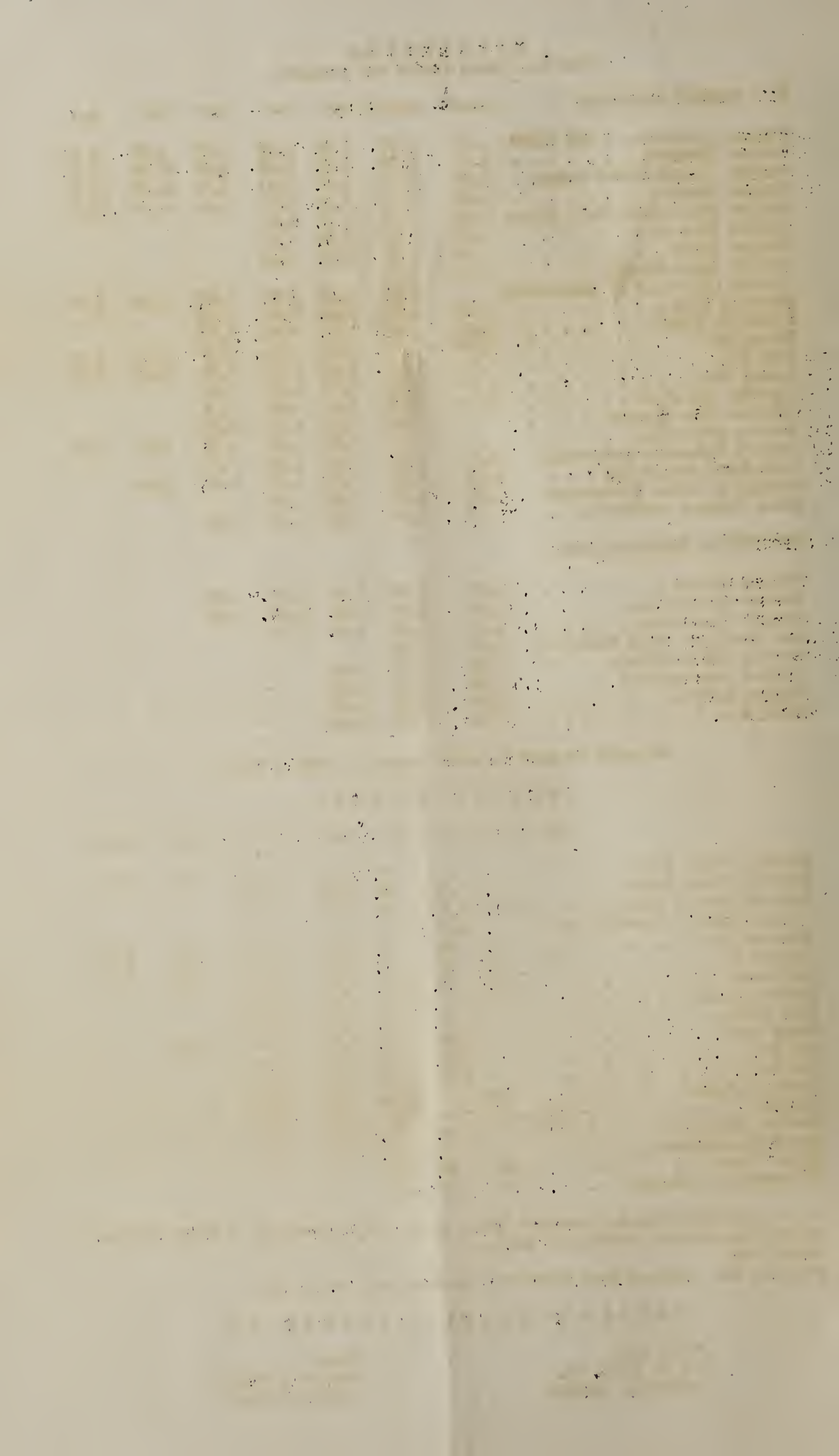

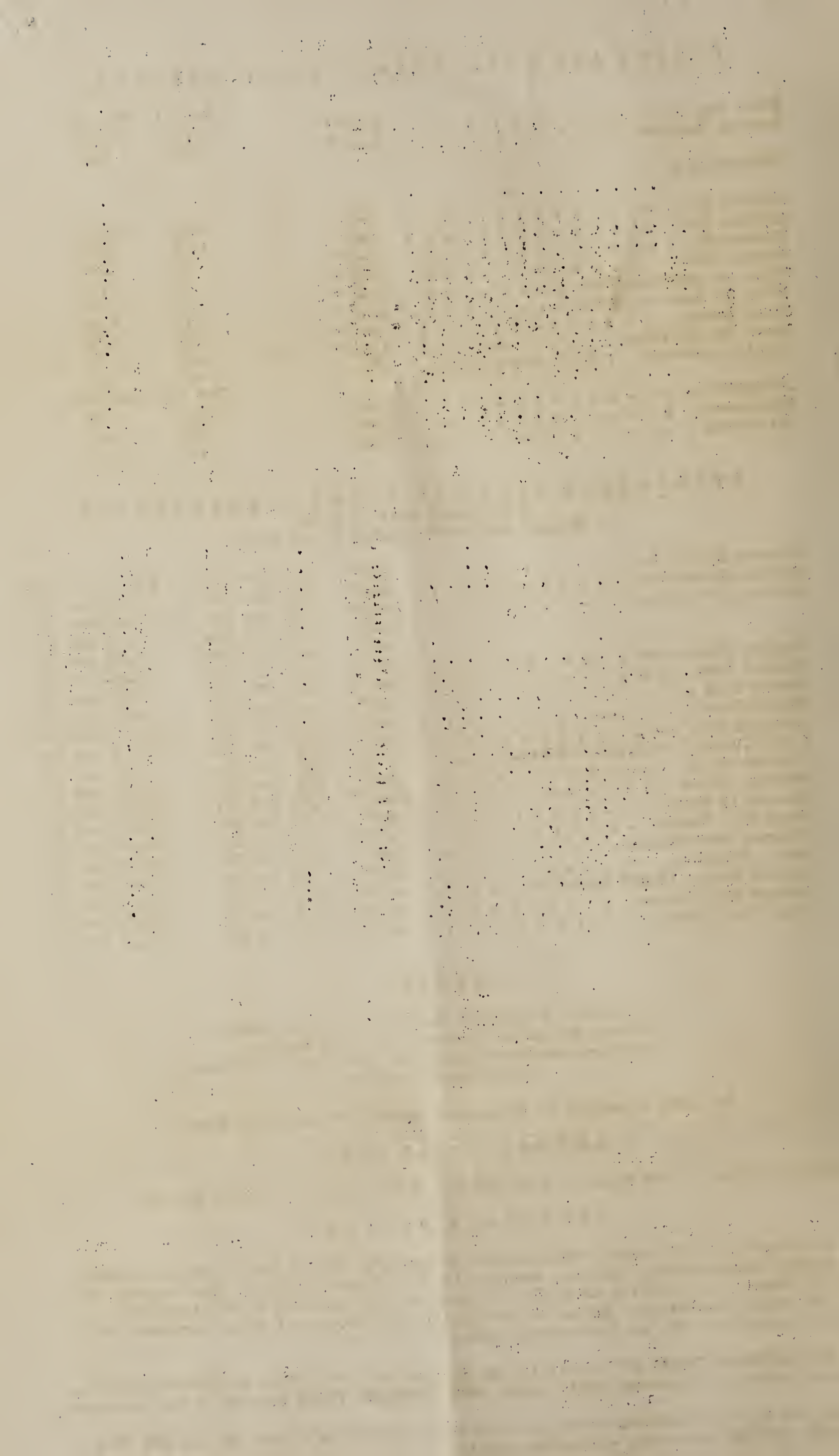
