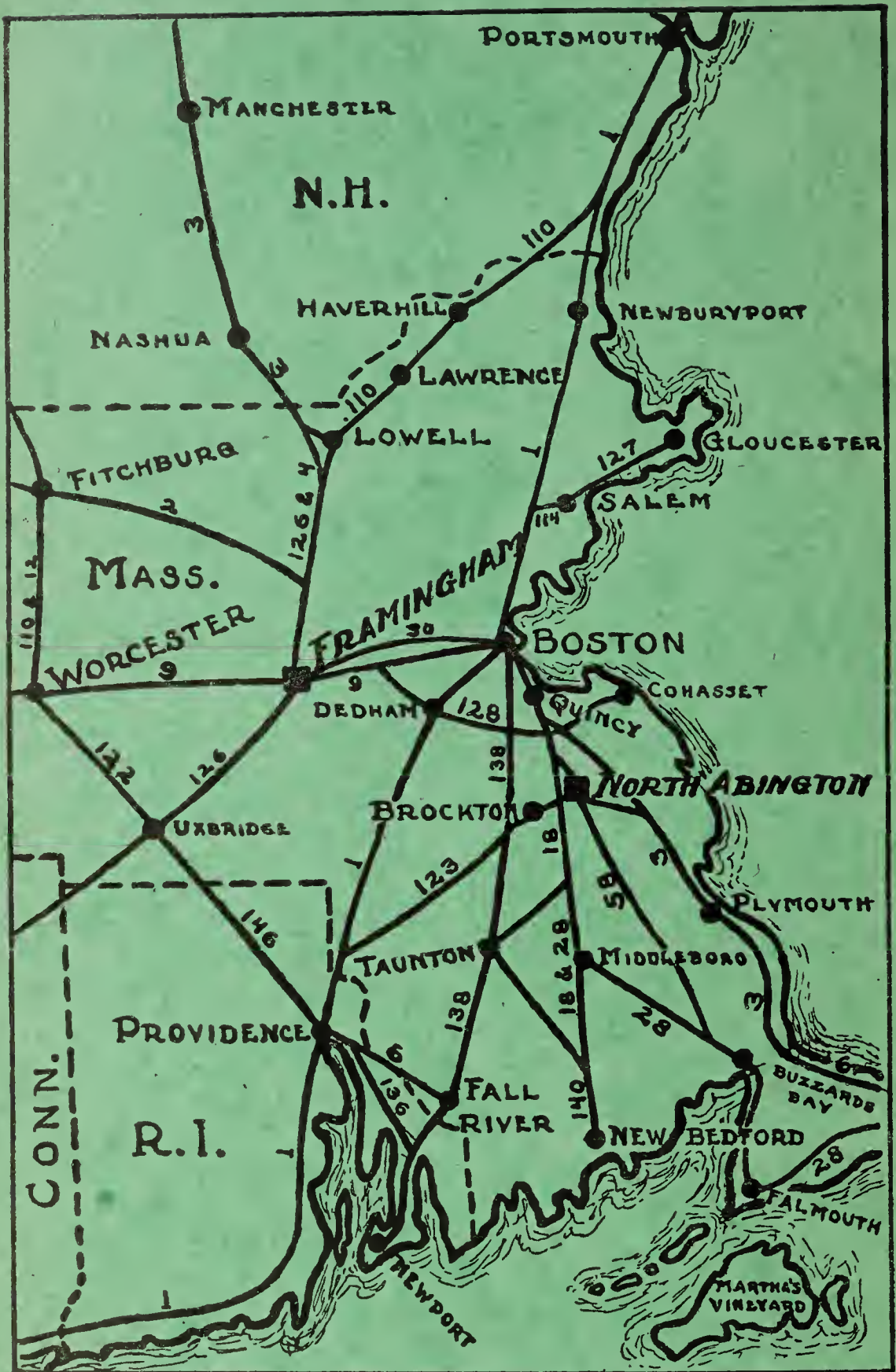

PLANTING SEASONS

SPRING SEASON — Begins as soon as the frost is out of the ground, usually about March 20. Continues until early June, although Evergreens and Perennials can be successfully planted until early July. Early planting, however, is preferable.

FALL SEASON — Evergreens can be transplanted from early August to late November; Perennials during September and October; Deciduous Trees and Shrubs from mid-September to late November. In their respective planting periods, the earlier parts are preferable — **ORDER EARLY.**

PLANT NAMES

We have endeavored to list our plants in accordance with the names as given in "Standardized Plant Names," which has been officially adopted by the American Association of Nurserymen.

If you have difficulty in finding here any varieties you wish, write us and we will immediately advise you whether or not we can furnish them.

PLACING ORDERS

Orders may be sent to either our office at North Abington, or to Framingham, as you may prefer or find more convenient.

In filling orders we shall select the best material from both nurseries. Frequent truck service is maintained between the two shipping headquarters, bringing to each place any particular items from the other establishment required for filling orders.

SHIPPING DIRECTIONS

In ordering nursery stock our customers are requested to state explicitly the mode of conveyance by which they wish their stock forwarded. We make shipments by express, freight, or motor truck. The price for all our material is at the nursery and does not include delivery. We can make shipment by motor truck at a moderate charge, provided the order is large enough to make a truckload. When no route or method is designated, we exercise our judgment. In no case do we assume responsibility after packages are shipped, except for our own mistakes. When losses occur by detention or mishandling, claim should at once be made on the transportation company by the consignee.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. The articles herein listed will be furnished in accordance with the following schedule:

1 to 4 plants of one kind and size will be priced at the each rate.

5 to 24 plants of one kind and size will be priced at the ten rate.

25 or more plants of one kind and size will be furnished at the hundred rate, when hundred rates are given.

FROM THIS SCHEDULE WE WILL NOT VARY because of the fact that considerable time is required to assemble an order made up of small lots of kinds that are widely separated over the nursery.

2. We make no charge for packing retail orders, except on very large evergreens and large shade trees, or other ungainly-shaped plants. On orders other than retail, packing will be charged extra at cost.

3. We give no warranty, expressed or implied, as to quality, description, productiveness of any nursery stock that we sell. The only guarantee that we make is that our stock is alive at time of shipment and true to name. No complaints will be considered that are not made forthwith upon receipt of order. Any stock ordered from this list found untrue to name, will be cheerfully replaced at the first favorable opportunity for planting, after it has been found not as ordered.

4. Super-specimen plants, selected by the customer, or by his representative, will be priced according to their individual values.

TERMS

Our terms are cash. Charge accounts, for 30 days credit, may be opened upon receipt of satisfactory credit references — allowing us time for investigation. All accounts unpaid after due date will be subject to sight draft without further notice. C. O. D. express shipments will be made (with collection charges added to the bill) only when order is accompanied by a deposit of at least 25 percent of the amount of the bill.

DISCOUNTS

A discount of 5 per cent may be deducted when payment in full accompanies the order. Charge accounts are subject to a discount of 2 per cent if paid within 10 days after date of invoice.
