Our nursery is located just 1½ miles west of the Northern Hotel, at 1500 Laporte Avenue.

Prices quoted herein include packing ready for delivery or shipment but do not include postage, express or freight. City delivery is free on orders of \$5.00 or more. All orders are accepted subject to our supply, and to loss through any cause not under our control.

Terms.—Cash on delivery. Terms may be made by special arrangement but 8 percent interest will be charged on all invoices after 30 days.

Planting Charges.—Minimum planting charge shall be \$1.00.

We grow a large number of perennials of different kinds which are ideal for rock gardens, borders in front of shrubbery, etc. Our price is 25c each for medium-sized, field-grown clumps. Large clumps are priced in proportion to their size. A few rare varieties or grafted plants such as Bristol Fairy Babybreath are priced higher.

Ferns

Our ferns come from Northern Minnesota and are hardy, sturdy, large-sized clumps which have given wonderful satisfaction the past four or five years. We have Ostrich, Lady, Osmunda, Evergreen, Maidenhair, Sensitive and Colorado Male ferns, priced at 35c each, \$2.50 per assorted dozen.

Gladiolus

We have about 15 named varieties in quantity, all of the large-flowered type, most of them late introductions. They have all been carefully treated with bi-chloride of mercury and are guaranteed to be free from thrips, dry rot and other fungus diseases. Prices vary from 2c to 10c each. We believe all our stock to be true to name and livable when it leaves the nursery. It has been inspected by the State Entomologist and certified as free from all insect pests and plant diseases.

Any stock which proves to be untrue to name or description, if reported by July 1 following delivery, will be replaced free of charge or the original amount paid will be refunded, but in no case shall we be liable for more than the original amount paid for such stock.

We shall replace in the fall or spring, for 50% of the current price, f. o. b. the nursery, any stock which does not show growth by July 1, following delivery, if we are notified by that date. We cannot, however, refund money for stock which does not grow, because we have no control over the care, weather and other factors which affect the livability of nursery stock after we deliver it.
