## Conditions of Sale

We believe all our stock to be true to name and livable when it leaves the nursery. It has been inspected by the State Entomologist and ertiffed as free from all insect pests and plant diseases.

Any stock which proves to be untrue to name or description, if reported by July 1 following delivery, will be replaced free of charge or the origianal amount paid will be refunded, but in no case shall we be liable for more than the original amount paid for such stock.

We shall replace in the fall or spring, for $\mathbf{5 0 \%}$ of the current price, f. o. b. the nursery, any stock which does not show growth by July 1, following delivery, if we are notified by that date. We cannot, however, refund money for stock which does not grow, because we have no control over the care, weather and other factors which affect the livability of nursery stock after we deliver it.
