Again thanking all who have contributed in making this evening a social and financial success, we beg to remain,



Games Begin at 9 P. M. Sharp.

During the Quarantine Riots in 1892 a detachment of the 47th Regiment, including Company I, did duty at Fire Island, and again in 1895 the organization did duty during the great Trolley Strike in Brooklyn.

At the outbreak of the war with Spain, the 47th responded to President McKinley's first call for volunteers and proceeded to Camp Black on May 2d, 1898. It was mustered into the United States service May 24th. In June the regiment was ordered to Fort Adams, near Newport, R. I., and on October 10th, 1898, it embarked on the U. S. Transport "Manitoba" for Porto Rico. It arrived at Ponce, P. R., on October 15th, 1898, and went into camp about three miles back of the city on October 18th. During the first night in camp the sentries were shot at and they returned the fire. The long roll was sounded, the call to arms, and all fell in ranks, but were soon dismissed. On October 21st the command broke camp and re-embarked on the U. S. Transport "Chester" and the various companies were sent to different stations; Company I going to Abonita, a town near the Abonita Pass, the highest point on the island, near which the battle of that name was fought. To reach Abonita the company marched from San Juan, a distance of about fifty-six miles, in less than three days—this bearing eloquent testimony to the morale and discipline of the men. In March, 1899, the company marched to Guayama, and was again embarked on the U. S. Transport "Manitoba," or the "Logan," as she was now called, and returned with the regiment to Brooklyn and were mustered out of the United States service March 31st. The 47th is distinguished with the 12th and 71st as the only regiments in the National Guard of New York which have done duty on foreign soil. On leaving Porto Rico the regiment was officially praised for its excellence by Generals Henry and Grant, under whom it had served.

The 47th Regiment has always responded instantly to the calls to duty in the spirit of its motto: "Ducit Amor Patriae," and, with its companions in arms, was publicly thanked by the civil and military authorities for its promptness and excellent conduct in service.

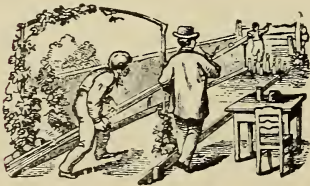
