

# Bovey Tracey & District Hospital.

THE HOSPITAL IS SUPPORTED BY VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS.

- I. Subscribers and Donors of One Guinea and upwards are entitled to one Letter of Recommendation for each Guinea.
- II. Terms for Admission of Patients :---
  - (a) Accidents and emergency cases requiring immediate operation are admitted at once, provided there is room, it being understood that Patients will pay the necessary charges upon leaving the Hospital.
  - (b) Patients applying for admission by Letter of Recommendation are required to fill up a form stating their income and the claims upon it.
  - (c) Private Patients are charged from  $f_{I-I-O}$  to  $f_{7-7-O}$  per week, according to circumstances; and if a Special Nurse is needed extra charge is made for her services and board.
- III. No Patient admitted under Paragraph (b) shall remain in the Hospital more than four weeks without a fresh Letter of Recommendation, or Special Order of the Committee.
- IV. All Patients are expected to conform to the Rules of the House.
- V. Visiting times at the Hospital are Sundays, 2-4 p.m., Tuesdays and Fridays, 3-4 p.m., and other times by special permission; subject in all cases to the Doctor's approval. Ministers of all denominations are allowed to visit Patients at any reasonable hour.
- VI. Dr. Arnott and his assistants give their services gratuitously to any Patients admitted to the Hospital free of charge. In other cases the Doctor's fees are a matter of arrangement between the Doctor and the Patient.

## Report, 1928.

The work of the Hospital during 1928 has well maintained the record of past years, the number of In-Patients admitted being 68 as against 64 in the previous year. Beyond this, the Hospital has been freely used for the treatment of small accidents and cases requiring daily dressing or massage.

The success of the Christmas Pound Day surpassed even that of 1927. There was a busy and cheerful scene in the little kitchen at the Hospital, where for a couple of hours the supply of tea and cakes on one table gradually disappeared as the pile of goodly packages on the other mounted higher and higher, an incredible number of people contriving somehow to pack in and enjoy the fun. Throughout the whole year, too, there has been a constant supply of vegetables, fruit and other gifts left at the Hospital. The Matron wishes specially to thank Mrs. Trelawny and her most neighbourly neighbour, Mrs. Hocking.

The new Secretaries of Alexandra Rose Day and Bovey Carnival Committees, Mrs. Trelawny and Mr. Melhuish, kept both events up to the high standard of former years. The Hospital Committee are most grateful to them, and to all who helped in producing such good results.

An alteration has been made in the Terms of Admission which both safeguards the benefits of the Hospital for the really necessitous, and brings us into line with the practice of the other Cottage Hospitals in the neighbourhood.

The Committee desire to place on record their grateful appreciation of the work done for the Hospital by the late Mr. Turner, both in his capacity as Hon. Treasurer and in many ways known only to those intimately connected with the Hospital. He will be greatly missed.

A word to all new Residents in the district—and to many old ones. A little Hospital so widely used, and with such a record of good work done since its foundation eighteen years ago, should surely be far more widely supported than the present list of subscribers shows.
