- 1 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate, Grenadier Guards, Royal Cypher on Grenade, old plate
- 2 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, Coldstream Guards, as worn by Grenadier Company, probably about Waterloo period, regimental title around Cross of St. George, above a grenade
- 3 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate, believed Household Cavalry, displaying Royal Arms on Garter Star
- 4 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, Officer's, believed Household Cavalry, displaying Garter Star
- 5 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, believed Coldstream Guards, Garter Motto around Royal Cypher G. R.
- 6 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, believed Scots Guards, Royal Cypher G. R. within Star of the Thistle
- 7 Ornament from Accoutrements of 3rd (King's Own) Hussars, V. R. within Garter inscribed "Nec Aspera Ferrent"
- 8 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of King's Dragoon Guards, G.R. inside Garter and motto

- 9 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 3rd (East Kent, The Buffs)
 Regt. of Foot, now the Buffs (East Kent Regiment),
 White Horse of Kent and "Invicta" over legend
 "The Buffs"
- 10 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 4th (King's Own) Regiment of Foot, now the King's Own (Royal Lancaster Regiment), "The Lion of England" above numeral within the Garter
- Regt. of Foot (1) St. George and the Dragon above numeral, above motto "Quo Fata Vocant," probably about 1820; (2) same device displayed on grenade, about twelve or fifteen years later when regiment was made fusiliers
- 12 Helmet Plate, The Devonshire Regiment, Castle of Exeter, and "Semper Fidelis" within garter
- 13 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, G. R. below "Gibraltar, 13 Sept. 1782," probably belonging to 12th (East Suffolk) Regt. of Foot, now the Suffolk Regiment, the senior of the four regiments entitled to "Gibraltar" (with the Castle and Key Badge and motto), probably dates from XVIIIth century
- 14 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 17th (Leicestershire)
 Regiment of Foot, now the Leicestershire Regiment,
 royal tiger and numeral with battle honours, and motto
 now disused "Veni et vici," prior to Crimean period
- 15 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, Officer's, 18th (Royal Irish)
 Regt. of Foot, harp and shamrock encircled with motto
 "Virtutis Namurcensis Præmium." (These are the
 earliest battle honours borne by any British regiment
 and granted for valour at Namur 1695). The plate is
 an old one
- 16 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 19th (1st York, North Riding)
 Regiment of Foot, now Princess of Wales' Own (Yorkshire Regiment), numeral XIX surmounted by crown.

 The plate is a very old one
- 17 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 20th (East Devon)
 Regiment of Foot, now Lancashire Fusiliers, numeral
 within wreath and crown, an old plate

- 18 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate, 23rd (Royal Welsh Fusiliers) Regiment of Foot, now R. Welsh Fusiliers, Regimental numeral and title and Prince of Wales's plume displayed on grenade, an old plate 2
- 19 (1) Very ornate Rectangular Plate of 25th (King's Own Borderers) Regiment of Foot, now King's Own Scottish Borderers; plate displays all regimental honours and mottoes, other than battle above numeral and title, about 1840-50. (2) Another Ornament as worn by same regiment prior to 1881
- 20 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 36th (Herefordshire) Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Worcestershire Regiment, numeral and title, a very old plate
- 21 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 43rd (Monmouthshire L. I.) Regt. of Foot, now 1st Batt. Oxfordshire Light Infantry, Regimental numeral within bugle and strings, the universal badge of Rifles and Light Infantry, an old plate
- Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Essex Regt., within Garter bearing motto "Montis Insignia Calpe," Castle and Key, and legend "Gibraltar," below regimental numeral
- 23 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 59th (2nd Notts) Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. East Lancashire, numeral within wreath, a very old plate
- 24 Pouch Belt Ornament of 60th (the King's Royal Rifle Corps), now the King's Royal Rifle Corps, Maltese cross displaying battle honours, numeral inside Light Infantry bugle, about 1830
- 25 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 46th (South Devon)
 Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Duke of Cornwall's L. I.
 numeral within wreath, an old plate
- Riding or King's Own L. I.) Regt. of Foot, now 1st Batt. King's Own (Yorkshire Light Infantry), numeral within French horn, only the Yorkshire L. I. and Highland L. I. (old 51st and old 71st) display the French horn in lieu of bugle and strings, an old plate

- 27 (1) Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 55th (Westmoreland)
 Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Border Regt. China
 dragon above numeral, about Crimean period. (2) Centre
 Ornament of Helmet Plate as now worn by Border
 Regiment, displaying on Maltese cross battle honours,
 with red and white enamel (commemorative of Arroyo
 dos Molines) Centre, on which is China dragon 2
- 28 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 62nd (Wiltshire) Regt. of Foot, now 1st Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment), battle honours on Maltese cross, regimental title in Garter, with numeral on red enamel in centre, about 1860
- 29 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 64th (2nd Staffs.)
 Regiment of Foot, now 1st Batt. Prince of Wales's
 (North Staffordshire Regiment), numeral above the
 regimental badge of "the Staffordshire knot," an old
 plate
- of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Welsh Regiment, in centre numeral and title, above "Waterloo," below "Bourbon." This corps and 86th (2nd R. Irish Rifles) are the only corps entitled to "Bourbon" honour, a very old plate
- 31 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 73rd (Perthshire) Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. Black Watch (Royal Highlanders), numeral, with battle honours "Mangalore," "Seringapatam," and "Waterloo," a very old plate. This corps is the only regiment entitled to "Mangalore."
- 32 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 76th Regiment of Foot, now 2nd Duke of Wellington's (West Riding Regiment), elephant with howdah above numeral, below "Hindostan." The badge of the "Old Immortals" of Lake's campaigns, about 1806
- 33 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Highland Light Infantry, regimental monogram within French horn, elephant with legend "Assaye" (old 74th, now 2nd Batt., badge) all on St. Andrew's cross, 1881

- 34 (1) Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Seaforth Highlanders, above elephant badge cypher of H.R.H. Frederick Duke of York, below stag's head and regimental title. (2) Waist Plate Belt, above stag's head cypher of H.R.H. Prince Leopold (late Duke of Albany), below motto "Tulloch Ard" (the high hill), the slogan of Kintail, 1881
- 35 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 79th (Cameron Highlanders) Regt. of Foot, now 1st Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders, regimental numeral, probably about 1850-1860
- 36 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 87th (Prince of Wales's Own Irish) Regt. of Foot, now 1st Batt. Princess Victoria's (Royal Irish Fusiliers), displays battle honours, viz. plume and "Barrosa" eagle, but not grenade. It is, therefore, prior to 1827, when the regiment was made Fusiliers. Legend is "Prince's Own Irish," their title from 1811 to 1827
- 37 (1) Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of 90th (Perthshire Volunteers)
 Regt. of Foot, now 2nd Batt. the Cameronians (Scottish
 Rifles), title in Garter, within G. R. cypher above numeral,
 a very old plate, probably end of last century. Corps
 was raised 1794, and was, until 1797, the only Light
 Infantry battalion in the Line. (2) Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of same corps, displays "Mandova"
 badge, to which only this corps and 92nd Gordon Highlanders are entitled, dates probably from about 1830 2
- 38 Ornament as worn by 92nd (Gordon Highlanders) Regt. of Foot, in centre of star of the Thistle numeral surmounted by "Bydand" (watchful), on arms of cross battle honours up to Waterloo, probably about 1820
- 39 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate Royal Marine Artillery, above Royal crest motto "Gibraltar," below it "Per Mare per Terram"
- 40 Pouch Belt Ornament as worn by Militia Battalions Rifle Brigade, plain Maltese cross without battle honours, in centre bugle and strings, around "Rifle Brigade," below cross "The Prince Consort's Own," 1881

- 41 Shako Plate, as worn by all Regiments of Foot (other than those with Fusilier or Highland headdresses), at commencement of century
- 42 Shako Plate of 1st Tower Hamlets (King's Own Light Infantry Militia), now 7th Batt. Rifle Brigade (Prince Consort's Own), prior to 1881
- 43 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 2nd Tower Hamlets (Queen's Own Light Infantry Militia), now 5th Batt. Rifle Brigade, on blue enamel in centre the Tower with bugle and strings above, on surrounding Garter regimental title, the whole surmounted by Royal crest, an old plate
- 44 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of City of Lichfield Volunteers, a device of dismembered armed men, surrounded by legend "City of Lichfield," 1793-1815
- 45 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of some City of London Volunteer Corps, City of London arms and motto "Domine Dirige Nos," 1793-1815
- 46 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Newcastle Volunteers, arms of Newcastle with N. on one and V. on other side, motto "Fortiter defensit Triumphans," 1793-1815
- 47 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Loyal Oswestry Volunteers, monogram L. O. V. surmounted by crown, 1793-1815
- 48 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of St. Olave's Volunteers, a London corps, G. R. cypher and crown, above "Pro Rege et Patria," below title, 1793-1815
- 49 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, a Light Infantry bugle surrounded by a Garter bearing legend "Liverpool Fusiliers," curious as combining Light Infantry emblem with Fusilier title, probably one of the Local Militia Regiments embodied between 1809-1816
- 50 Two Naval Oval Shoulder Belt Plates. I. Officer's, above cypher G. R. "Proserpine" below naval trophy, most probably belonging to an officer of H.M.S. Proserpine, wrecked in the Elbe in 1799; II. A Seaman's, carrying anchor and crown badge
- 51 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Bandon Boyne Corps of Infantry, Bridge of Bandon with above legend "Bandon Boyne," Irish Volunteers of 1782

- 52 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Drumkeen Infantry, harp and crown between G. R., above "Drumkeen" below "Infantry," Irish Volunteers of end of last century
- 53 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Waterford Corps, harp and crown, below "Waterford," Irish Volunteers, same period as preceding lot
- 54 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, a figure of William III on horse-back above date 1690, around "Bandon Boyne Yeomanry," "Glorious Memory," Irish Yeomanry, end of last century
- 55 I. Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, Harp and Crown between letters L. and C., and below date 1796, above "Pro Rege," below "Et Patria"; II. Same, but more elaborately engraved, believed to be Loyal Cork Cavalry and Loyal Cork Infantry, Irish Volunteer Corps of that date
- 56 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate (silver), Harp and Crown between letters A. and C., and below date 1797, above "For our King," below "& Country," believed to be Armagh Cavalry, an Irish Volunteer Corps of that date
- 57 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, Shield bearing Lion, Harp, and Castle surmounted by a crown, with on one side 17, on other 97, above "Tam Marte," below "Quam Minervæ," believed to be Londonderry Loyal Volunteers of that date
- 58 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, above monogram L.V. a crown, believed Lincoln Volunteers of 1790
- 59 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate, above monogram S.I.V. a crown, believed Sheffield Independent Volunteers, period 1793-1815
- 60 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Independent Broadstairs Gunners, on a shield Arms of Sandwich, above "In dependent Broadstairs," below "Gunners," period 1793-1815
- 61 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of St. Martin's Volunteers, St. Martin dividing his cloak with the Beggar, below "St. Martin's," a London corps of the period 1793-1815
- 62 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of East Grinstead Cavalry, around motto G. R. regimental title, Volunteer Corps, period 1793-1815

- 63 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Plymouth Independent Rangers, arms and motto of Plymouth, above which a trophy of arms with legend "Victory or Death," and below regimental title, Volunteers of period 1793-1815
- 64 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of East Budleigh regiment, around cypher G.R. regimental title in Garter. Volunteers of period 1793-1815
- 65 Ornament worn by Warrington Volunteers of period 1793-1815, on a star G.R. in oval with regimental title around
- 66 Shako Plate of Ramsgate Harbour Loyal Volunteer Artillery, period 1793-1815
- 67 Silver Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Volunteer Corps, period 1793-1815, crown over monogram C.V.
- 68 Shako Plate of West Kent L. I. Militia, now 3rd Batt. the Queen's Own (R. West Kent) Regiment, prior to territorial organization of 1881, White Horse of Kent within Bugle and Strings
- 69 Shako Plate of Bedfordshire L. I. Militia, now 3rd Batt. the Bedfordshire Regiment, prior to 1881
- 70 Shako Plate of 2nd Somerset Militia, now 4th Batt. the Prince Albert's (Somersetshire) Light Infantry, prior to 1881
- 71 Shako Plate of Royal Berkshire Militia, now 3rd Batt. the Berkshire Regiment, prior to 1881, stag under oak, and motto is old badge of Berkshire Militia, adopted since 1881 on helmet plates of line battalions
- 72 Shako Plate Oxfordshire Militia, now 4th Batt. Oxfordshire Light Infantry Militia; an Ox crossing a Ford, with the motto "Tortis est Veritas," is the Arms of the City of Oxford; the numeral 51 denotes their militia precedence prior to the territorial organization, prior to 1881
- 73 Pouch Belt Ornament, North York Rifles Militia, now 4th Batt. the Princess of Wales's Own (Yorkshire Regt.), Badge the White Rose of York, prior to 1881
- 74 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Leicestershire Militia, now 3rd Batt. Leicestershire Regiment, about Crimean period, within Garter Cross of St. George

- 75 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate (silver) of 5th Royal Jersey Militia, about Crimean period
- 76 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 1st Royal Lanark Militia, now 3rd and 4th Batts. Highland Light Infantry, about Crimean period, on St. Andrew's Cross, Thistle and Motto
- 77 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Royal Aberdeenshire Highlanders, now 3rd Batt. Gordon Highlanders; 89 denotes their militia precedence about Crimean period
- 78 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate Royal Sherwood Foresters (Notts)
 Militia, now 4th Batt. the Sherwood Foresters (Derbyshire Regt.), G.R. Cypher and Crown, period 1800-1812
- 79 Badge worn by Royal Second Middlesex Rifles (Edmonton)
 Militia, now 7th Batt. King's Royal Rifles Corps, Royal
 Crest encircled with regimental title
- 80 Badge, as worn by the 78th Highlanders (Rosshire Buffs, now 2nd Battalion the Seaforth Highlanders), within thistle wreath elephant, over "Cuidich'n Righ" (Help to the King), the motto of the Mackenzies, below 78, prior to 1881 (see also lot 34)
- 81 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of Halifax local Militia; in centre white rose of York, around title, and above bugle and strings, local militia, 1809-1816
- 82 Rectangular (square cut corners) silver Shoulder Belt Plate, within a quarter inscribed "East Monmouth," cypher G. R., probably a local militia, period 1809-1816
- 83 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate; a trophy of cannon and flags, in centre the supporters of the royal arms sustain an oval which has within the letters R. Y. F., on base of sinister cannon cypher G. R., unknown
- 84 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Newfoundland Royal Veteran Company; above scroll inscribed Newfoundland letters R. V. with crown above, early part of this century
- 85 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate; in centre phænix rising from a scroll inscribed "renovatus," above a crown, below a double turreted battlement, on which are letters R. V., probably worn by one of the veteran battalions of the early part of century

- 86 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate; figure 9 with grenade above, probably Grenadier Company of 9th Veteran Battalion, Peninsular War period
- 87 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Barbados Militia; crown, superscribed above "Barbados," below, "Militia," early part of century
- 88 Turban Badge of 49th Madras Infantry (Hon. East India Company); on blue enamel XLIX., encircled by garter, inscribed "Madras Infantry," this regiment was disbanded soon after the Indian Mutiny, on the reorganization of the Indian army
- 89 Square Shoulder Belt Plate of 1st West India Regiment (now 1st Battalion West India Regiment); on white enamel the figure 1, surrounded by garter inscribed "West India," above and on either side the battle honours, "Dominica," "Martinique," "Guadeloupe"
- 90 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate; monogram L. P., within garter inscribed Loyal Infantry, probably Loyal Pimlico Volunteers, of period 1793 to 1815
- 91 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Royal African Colonial Corps; cross of St. George encircled with garter, inscribed with regimental title, early part of century
- 92 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of Fifeshire Fencibles; on a cross of St. Andrew the "Thane of Fife," the crest of the Earls (now Dukedom) of Fife, and above the badge the figure IX, this corps was raised in 1794, and disbanded in 1803
- 93 Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of the Caithness Legion; over thistle and crown "Caithness," below the legend "Flodden Field," this corps was a Scotch Fencible Regiment raised in 1796, and disbanded in 1802
- 94 Square Shoulder Belt Plate of Warrington Local Militia; Lancaster rose surrounded by garter and motto, with above the coronet of the County Palatine of Lancaster, one of the local militia regiments, embodied 1809-1816
- 95 Shako Plate of Militia Battalion, prior to 1881; within a French horn numeral 2

- 96 Waist Plate of H. E. I. Co.'s Madras Engineers, now Queen's Own Corps of Madras Sappers and Miners; around three cannon "Madras Engineers," above "Seringapatam," on either side "Java," "Ava," about 1850
- 97 Pouch Belt Ornament of Volunteer Corps; emblem, a winged dragon, unknown
- 98 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of XIth Madras Infantry, old East India's Company's Regiment; around XI on green enamel, garter inscribed "Seringapatam," an old plate
- 99 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate of 1st Company Nizam's Artillery, now no. 1 Field Battery of the Hyderabad Contingent; around a gun regimental title, above "Mahidpore," below "Nowuh"
- 100 Rectangular Shoulder Belt Plate, unknown
- 101 Pouch Belt Ornament of 1st Middlesex (Victoria and St. George's) Volunteers (now 1st V. B. King's Royal Rifle Corps); emblem, St. George and the Dragon
- 102 Pouch Ornament of First Bombay Light Cavalry (Lancers),
 H. E. I. Company's Regt. (now 1st Duke of Connaught's Own), Bombay Lancers, on crossed lances monogram B. L. C., and around "First Lancers," below "Ghuznee," "Afghanistan," about Mutiny period
- 103 Pair of Bit Bosses as now worn by all mounted officers of infantry, in centre Union Badge, with a garter around "Infantry Mounted Officers"
- 104 I. Oval Shoulder Belt Plate of N. Somerset Yeomanry; lion holding shield on which is royal cypher G. R. and around cypher, garter and motto, above "North Somerset Yeomanry," below "Forward"; II. The same only without regimental title, very old plates
- 105 Pouch Belt Ornament, in centre of Maltese Cross, Prince of Wales Plume around Prince of Wales's Own Royal Regiment
- 106 Pouch Belt Ornament of Seventh Surrey Volunteers, now 4th V.B. East Surrey Regiment, French horn above numeral 7 around "Seventh Surrey Rifles"

- 107 Two badges, unknown; I. On an 8-point star a dragon, and around the motto "Cœlum non animum muto"; II. Circular; in centre an armed Highlander, around the motto "Touch one touch a"
- 108 Square Shoulder Belt Plate of East Lothian Yeomanry
 Cavalry, now Lothians and Berwickshire Yeomanry,
 regimental monogram within thistle wreath, Sir Walter


