## INTRODUCTION.

The Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn are presented with the sixth regular Catalogue, which it is hoped will be found to have made some approximation towards accuracy and completeness. So much new matter, important to all having an interest in the Cemetery, has claimed admission to the book, thus rendering the Catalogue but a part of it, that it has been thought practicable to adopt a different arrangement.

Accordingly the fundamental law of the Corporation is first introduced, followed by the By-Laws, which now, for the first time, -by the careful labor of the Trustees in collecting the scattered votes of a quarter of a century, and in pruning off and inserting new provisions - are thrown into a Code. In this code new and old enactments are so closely interwove., that it would be difficult to remark particularly upon its new features, while such service is rendered impracticable by its systematic arrangement. New wants will, it is not unlikely, require further provisions; but it is thought that present wants are amply met.

No material change has been made in the Regulations for Admission, which are contained in Art. 27, and in Appendix D.

The legal forms presented in Appendix C, are the same as heretofore in use.

To the usual form of conveyance of land, a new covenant has been added, growing out of the plan recently proposed and adopted to secure a fund for the perpetual care and preservation of the Cemetery, in effect pledging the good faith of the Corporation in every sale made, to the steady accumulation of said fund.

The very able Report by the Committee, unfolding the above mentioned plan, which, it should be added, received the approval of several most eminent lawyers, may be found upon the 34th page,
and will well repay a careful perusal on the part of proprietors, among whom the subject has already excited a deep interest.

A new form of conveyance has been added for the intermediate spaces between lu:-

In pursuance of a requirement in the By-Laws, a list of the lots, the repair of which has been contracted for by the Corporation, is here published, torether with the names of the proprietors, and the sums respectively devoted to that purpose.

The Catalogue of proprietors and their lots, has been prepared with much labor and care, the numerical and alphabetical parts have been very diligently compared to insure a correspondence, and the plan of lots and the grounds has been thoroughly revised. By perseverance, many errors in former editions have been corrected, in regard to some of which no ready means of information were presented. Some errors, in the nature of things, can hardly become known, until the occurrence of some accident; among these, for example, is the discrepaney between the actual and the recorded loeation of a lot, which, it is supposed, has generally arisen from a change of location, after the original selection was reported. Few such errors, however, have occurred, and it is believed that very few, if any, will hereafter be found to exist.

The upper portion of Garden Pond, together with the old house and out buildings, formerly used by the Superintendent, have been effaced from the plan; and it will be seen that a large and very desirable range, extending from Central Avenue to the easterly line, and embracing the whole north eastern portion of the Cemetery, will, in due time, be opened for occupation. The removal of the hill near the gate, which has been nearly effected, will enlarge the view from without, and add to the beauty of the Cemetery:

Another new feature of the Catalogue, to which much time and labor hare been devoted, is the publication of a large list of representatives of lots of deceased proprietors. It was found that between three and four hundred of the names upon the Catalogue were those of deceased proprietors, whose heirs or devisees, in most cases, had no voice or vote in the doings of the corporation, and no one, of course, to exercise legal control over their respective lots. It was considered that the Catalogue should contain, so far as possible, an aecurate list of proprietors, and the legal
representatives of dcceased proprietors, so that it might easily be known upon inspection who are members of the Corporation. Many votes offered at the last annual meeting were thrown out, becanse offered by persons who had not, in compliance with the Charter, been designated to represent the lots of deceased proprictors.

With this notice, and after the efforts that have been made to apprize all such of their privileges, it is hoped that none will be disfranchised through their own ignorance or inattention.

A list of the few persons who have the right to locate lots, is found at the end of the numerical Catalogue.

As an item of historic interest, there is presented (see page 13,) a tabular view of the officers since the commencement of the Cemetery. For the first four years; Mount Auburn was under the direction of "the Garden and Cemetery Committee," a board of nine gentlemen elected annually by the Massachusetts Iorticultural Society. Since the present Corporation assumed the control, the practice has been, till the last two years, to choose nine Trustees, under a Charter, which allows " not less than seven nor more than twelve." For two years twelve have been chosen.

With these observations, it is deemed proper to conclude with some suggestions-which will probably here receive greater publicity among the Proprietors than through any other medium under the head of

## MEMORANDA FOR PROPRIETORS.

## TRANSFERS.

The Recorls of the Corporation are the only evidence of the title of a proprietor recognized by the Corporation. Consequently when a person receives a lot by transfer from a proprietor, he should send his deed at once to the office of the Secretary for record. This suggestion would almost seem unnecessary; but experience has proved it otherwise, since the record of such transfers has sometimes been neglected for years, and sometimes the deed has been sent to the County Registry for record.

## TRANSFER BY WILL.

The foregoing remarks are also applicable to lots devised to any person. The certified copy of the will containing any such devise, should be exhibited to the Secretary, and the proper extract from the same, with the necessary certificate, will be recorded upon a book prepared for this purpose, and reference will be made thereto upon the original record. It matters not whether such devise is expressed in such general terms as are often contained in the residuary clause, or whether the lot is specifically mentioned. While the former course is very frequent, the latter is the better one. But, in either case, the record should be made.

Persons in disposing of their lots by will, should bear in mind that, as by the Charter there can be but one proprietor of a lot, a devise of it to more than one person cannot be recognized by the Corporation. If the design is to transmit it to more than one, the better way is to devise it to one as trustee.

SOLE HEIR AT LAW.
By reference to the 8th Section of the Charter, and to the 19th ByLaw, it will be seen that provision is made for any one who claims to be the sole heir at law of a proprietor, to assert his title to a lot. After making the affidavit required, he will be regarded as having presumptive title, and will be treated as the proprietor till the contrary shall be made to appear.

## REPRESENTATIVE OF A DECEASED PROPRIETOR.

Section 8th of the Charter, and Articles 15th and 19th of the By-Laws, indicate the importance of giving attention to this matter. The need of such representative results from the provision of the Charter that a lot can have but one proprietor. Consequently, upon his death, whenever it may fall by devise or inheritance to several persons, provision is made for one of them to step into the place of such proprietor, and exercise the legal control of the lot during the continuance of his appointment, which is revocable, and may last for his lifetime, or may be superseded at any time, as circumstances shall require. Of course, therefore, no heir or devisee parts with any title which he may have, by reason of such
appointment of his co-heir or devisee. It is the practice of the Trustees to appoint such representative upon the petition of the parties in interest, in which the person deemed by them most suitable or desirable is nominated. Such person may be the husband or the widow of the deceased, or either of the children of proper age, the guardian of minor children, or a trustee under the will - preference generally being given, however, to a person resident in this vicinity, or to the one residing nearest to the Cemetery.

A blank for such petition may always be had upon application to the Secretary, who will furnish any requisite information upon the subject.

## CARE OF LOTS.

A book is kept at the Superintendent's office, at the Cemetery, in which are entered all orders for the care of lots. Proprietors should be particular to specify what care they desire to be devoted to their lots, and, so far as is possible, contract for a fixed price. All orders thus given will be regarded as in force until revoked. They need not be renewed from year to year. It is desirable that they should be in writing.

## ERRORS AND CHANGES IN THE CATALOGUE.

Whenever any errors are noticed in the Catalogue or plan, in the names of proprietors, or the number or location of their lots, or when they desire a change of residence to be entered, notice should be given at once to the Secretary.

## AN ACT

## TO INCORPORATE THE PROHLLETORS OF THE CEMETERY OF mount auburn.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That Joseph Story, John Davis, Jacob Bigelow, Isaae Parker, George Bond, and Charles P. Curtis, together with such other persons as are proprietors of lots in the Cemctery at Mount Auburn, in the towns of Cambridge and Watertown, in the County of Middlesex, and who shall in writing signify their assent to this Aet, their suceessors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a Corporation, by the name of the Proprictors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn, and they shall have all the powers and privileges contained in the statute of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, chapter eighty-three.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That the said Corporation may take and hold in fee simple the Garden and Cemetery at Mount Auburn, now held by the Massachusetts Horticultural Society, and any other lands adjacent thereto, not exceeding fifty ares in addition to said Garden and Cemetery, upon the same trusts and for the same purposes, and with the same powers and privileges as the said Massachusetts Horticultural Society now hold the same by virtue of the statute of the year one thousand eight hundred and thinty-one, chapter sixty-nine ; and may also tako and hold any personal estate not exceeding in
valuo fifty thousand dollars, to bo applied to purposes connected with and uppropriato to tho objects of sail establislment.

Secmon id. Bo it further enacted, that all persums whoshall hereafter becomo proprietors of lots in said Cemetery, of a sizo not less, each, tham throe hmedred siquaro feet, shall thereby bocome members of the said Corporation.

Suermen 1. Bo it furthor enacted, That tho oflieers of tho said Corporation shall consist of not less than serem nor more than fwelvo 'Trustees, a Treasurer, Secetary, and sueh other oflieers as they may dieet. Tho Trostees shall ho elected anmally, at the ammal meeting, and shall hoth their ofliees mutil others are chosen. And they shall ehoso ono of their number to be President, who shall bo alsio President of the Corporation; and they shall also choose the Seeretary and Treasurer, either from their own body or at largo. And the said Trustees shall havo the general management, superintendenco and earo of the property, expenditures, business and prodential coneorns of the Corporation, and of the sales of lots in the said Cemetery, and they slath make a report of their doings to tho Corporation at their ammal meeting. The Treasurer shall give bonds for tho faithful disecharge of the duties of his ofliee, and shall have tho supremtendenco and management of the fiseal comeerns of the Corporation, subject to the revision and control of the I'rustees, to whom ho shall make an anmal report, whieh shall be laid bofore the Corporation at their ammal meeting. And the Secretary shall ho under oath for tho fathtul performane of tho duties of his oflieo, and shall reoord the doings at all meetings of the Corporation and of the Trmstres.

Sweron 5. Se it further enacted, That tho ammal meetings of sabl C'orporation shall ho holden at sueh timo and placo as the ly-laws shall direet, and the Soretary shall give notiee thereof in ome or more newspapers, printed in biston, seren days at least lofore the timo of meeting. And spectal meetings may be called by the Trustees in the samo manner, unless oth-
erwise directed by the by-laws; or by tho Secetary, in the same mamer, upon the written request of twenty members of the Corporation. At all meetings, a quormu for business shall comsist of not less than seven members ; and any business may be transacted, of which notice shall be given in tho advertisements for tho meoting, and all grestions shall ho deeded hy a majority of the members present, and voting either in person or by proxy.

Surrion 6. Bo it further enacted, That as soon as the said Corporation shall have received from tho Massachasetts Mortienltual Society a legal conveyanco of the said Garten and Cemetory at Mome Auburn, the Massachusetts Hortienltural Society shall cease to have any rights, powers and anthorities over the same ; and all the rights, powers and anthorities, husts, immunities and privileges conferted upon tho said Society, and upon the proprictors of lots in the said Cemotery in and loy virthe of the lirst section of tho statate of the year ono thomsimd eight humbed and thirty-one, chapter sixty-nine, shall ho tramsferred to amd exorcised liy the Corporation ereated hy this Aet ; and tho same shall, to all intents amt purposes, apply to tho satid Corporation, and all propriotors of lots in the said Cemetery, with the same fored and effect as if the same were herein specially enacted, and the said Corporation substituted for the Massachusetts IIorticultural Society herehy.

Sburon 7. Be it further enactel, That any person wha shall willfully ilestroy, mutilate, deface, injure or remove any tomb, momment, grave-stono or other structure placed in the Cometery aforesaid, or any fomer, miling or other work for the protection or ormament of any tomb, momment, grave-stone or other structure aforesaid, or of any remetery lot, within the limits of the Garden and Centery aforesaid, or shatl willfully destroy, remove, cut, break or injure any tree, shonb or plant within the limits of the said Garden and Cemetery, or shall shoot or discharge any gun or other firearm within the said lim-
its, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon convietion thereof lofore any Justice of the Peace or other court of' compotent jurisadetion within the comnty of Middleses, be punished by a time not less than live Dollars nor more than Fitty Dollars, aceording, to the nature and aggravation of the oftence; and such offender shall also be liable, in an action of trespass, to ho hrought against him in any court of competent jurisdiction, in the namo of the Proprietors of the Cemetery of Momet Auburn, to pay all sueh danages as shall have been oeeasioned ly his mawful act or acts; which money, when reeorered, shath bo applied hy the said Corporation, under the direction of the Board of 'Trustees, to the reparation and restoration of the property destroyed or injured as ahove, and members of tho said Corporation shall bo eompetent witnessos in such suits.

Srerton S. Be it further enacted. That the lots in said Cemetery shald bo indivisible ; and upon the death of any proprietor of any lot in the said Cemetery containing not less than three hundred symare feet, the devisee of such lot, or the heir at law, as the case may be, shall he entitled to all the privileges of membership as aforesadd ; and if there be more than one devise or heir at law of each lot, tho loard of Trmstees for the timo being stall designate which of the said derisees or leeirs at law shall represent the said lot, and rote in the meetings of the Corporation; - which designation shall continue in foree, mitil by death, remoral or other etlicient eanso, another designation shall become neessary: and, in making such designation the Trustees shall, as far as they comemiently may, give the preferenco to males orer females, aml to proximity of hlood and priority of age, having due regard, howerer, to proximity of residence.

Sermos !). Bo it further emacted, That it shall he lawful for the said Corporation to take and hohe any gramt, donation or hequest of property, upou trust, to apply the income thereof, under the direction of the board of 'Trustees, for the improve-
ment or ombellishment of the said Gemetery or of the Gimden adjacent thereto, or of any buildings, strmetmes or fenens erected or being erected 1 pon the lands of tho satid Corporation, or of any individual proprictor of a lot in the Cometery, on for tho repair, preservation, or renewal of any tomb, momment, gravestane, fence or railing, or wher erection in or aromel any Cemetery lot, or for the planting and cmlivation of treess, shrubs, flowers, or plants in or aromed any Comotery lot, aceorling to the terms of such grant, donation or hequest ; and the Supromes Julicial Court in this Commonwealth, we any other court therein having equity jurisdiction, shall have full power and juristiction, to compel the duo pertionamee of the said trasts, or any of them, "pon a bill filed hy a proprietor of any lot in tho said Cemetery for that purpose.

Sremon 10. Be it firther enacted an follows: First, That the present propricturs of lots in the said ('emetery, who shall hecome members of the Corporation ereated hy this Aet, shall henceforth erase to tre mombers of the said Horticultural Sieciety, so far as their membership therein depents on their heing proprietors of lots in the said Cemetery. Seromlly, Ihat the sales of the Cemetery lots shath contime to bo made as fist as it is practicablo lyy tho Comporation ereated hy this Act, at a price not less than the smu of sixty dollars for every lot combaining three hombed square feed, and so in proportion fir any greater or less gnambity, unless the said Hortienltural Sociely and the Corporation ereated hy his Act, slall mutually arree to sell the same at a less price. Thirilly, That the proceeds of the lirst sales of such lots, after dedncting the ammal expenses of the Cemetery establishment, shall be applied to the extinguishment of the present delats due by tho said Horticultmal Suciety on aceomt of the said Garden and (emetery, And after tho extingnishment of the satid dehts, the batane of the said proceeds, and proceseds of all fitture sales, shall ammally, on the first Monday of avery gent, ho divided bedween the mid

Horticultural Society and the Corporation created by this Act, in manner following, namely: - Fourteen hundred dollars shall be first deducted from the gross proceeds of the sales of lots during the preceding year, for the purpose of defraying the Superintendent's salary and other incidental expenses of the Cemetery establishment ; and the residue of the said gross proceeds shall be divided between the said Horticultural Society and the Corporation created by this Act, as follows, namely: one-fourth part thereof shall be received by and paid over to the said Horticultural Society, on the first Monday of January of every year, and the remaining three-fourth parts shall be detained and held by the Corporation created by this Act, to their own use forever. And if the sales of any year shall be less than fourteen hundred dollars, then the deficiency shall be a charge on the sales of the succeeding year or years. Fourthly, The money so received by the said Horticultural Society shall be forever devoted and applied by the said Society to the purposes of an experimental garden, and to promote the art and science of Horticulture, and for no other purpose. And the money so retained by the Corporation created by this Act, shall be forever devoted and applied to the preservation, improvement, embellishment and enlargement of the said Cemetery and Garden, and the incidental expenses thereof, and for no other purpose whatsoever. Fifthly, a Committee of the said Horticultural Society, duly appointed for this purpose, shall, on the first Monday of January of every year, have a right to inspect and examine the books and accounts of the Treasurer, or other officer acting as Treasurer of the Corporation created by this Act, as far as may be necessary to ascertain the sales of lots of the preceding year.

Svertion 11. Be it further enacted, That any three or more of the persons named in this Act shall have authority to call the first meeting of the said Corporation, by an advertisement in one or more newspapers, printed in the City of Boston, seven days,
at least, before the time of holding such meeting, and specifying the time and place thereof. And all proprictors of lots, who shall before, at or during the time of holding such meeting, by writing, assent to this Act, shall be entitled to vote in person or by proxy at the said furst meeting. And at any such meeting or any such adjournment thereof, any elections may be had, and any business done, which are herein authorized to be had and done at an annual meeting, although the same may not be specified in the notice for the said meeting. And the first Board of Trustees, chosen at the said mecting, shall continue in office until the annual meeting of the said Corporation next ensuing their choice, and until another Board are chosen in their stead, in pursuance of this Act.

Section 12. Be it further enacted, That the said Cemetery shall be and hereby is declared exempted from all public taxes, so long as the same shall remain dedicated to the purposes of a Cemetery.

## AN ACT IN ADDITION TO AN ACT ENTITLED "AN ACT TO INCORPORATE TIE MASSACHUSETTS HORTICULTUHAL SOCIETY゙."

Section I. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That the Massachusetts Horticultural Society be and hereby are authorized, in addition to the powers already conferred on them, to dedieate and appropriate any part of the real estate now owned or hereafter to be purchased by them, as and for a Rural Cemetery or Burying Ground, and for the erection of Tombs, Cenotaphs, or other Monuments, for or in memory of the dead : and for this purpose to lay out the same in suitable lots or other subdivisions, for family and other burying places; and to plant and embellish the same with shrubbery, flowers, trees, walks, and other rural ornaments, and to enclose and divide the same with proper walls and enclosures, and to make and amex thereto other suitable appendages and conveniences, as the Society shall from time to time deem expedient. And whenever the said Society shall so lay out and appropriate any of their real estate for a Cemetery or Burying Ground, as aforesaid, the same shall be deemed a perpetual dedieation thereof for the purposes aforesaid ; and the real estate so dedieated shall be forever held by the said Society in trust for such pur-
poses, and for none other. And the said Soricty shall have anthority to grant and convey to any person or persons the sole and exclusive right of hurial, and of ereeting tombs, cenotaphs, and other momments, in my such designated lots and snbdivisions, upon such terms and conditions, and subject to such regulations as the said Society shall by their by-laws and regulations preseribe. And every right so granted and conveyed shall be held for the purposes aforesaid, and for none other, as real estate, by the proprietor or proprietors thereof, and shall not lie sulyject to attachment or excention.

Section II. Be it further enacted, That for the pmopeses of this Act, the said Society shall be and herely are authorized to purchase and hold any real estate not execeding ten thonsamd dollars in value, in addition to the real estate whieh they aro now hy law anthorized to purchase and hold. And to enable the said Society more effectually to carry the plim aforesaid into effect, and to provide funds for the same, the said Society shall be and hereby are authorized to open subscription books, upon such terms, conditions and regulations as the said Society shall preseribe, which shall be deemed fundamental and perpetual articles between the said Society and the sulseribers. Aul every person who shall become a subseriber in conformity thereto, shall be deemed a member for life of the said Society without the payment of any other assessment whatsoever ; and shall moreover be entitled, in fee simple, to the sole and exchasive right of using, as a place of burial, and of ereeting tombs, cenotaphs, and other monuments, in sueh lot or subdivision of such cemetery or lorying ground, as shall, in conformity to such fundamental artieles, be assigned to him.

Suctron III. Be it further enacted, That the President of the Suciety shall have authority to call any special meeting or meetings of the said Society, at such time and place as he shall direct, for tho purpose of carrying into effect any or all the pur-
poses of this Act, or any other purposes within the purview of the original Act to which this Act is an addition.

an act in addition to an "act to incoriorate the rao prietors of the cemetery of hount auburn."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Gencral Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
The Corporation known as the Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn, may purchase and hold in fee simple, or otherwise, any real estate or any interest in any real estate situate and lying in the towns of Cambridge and Watertown, in the County of Middlesex, anything in the act of this Legislature passed March thirty-first, A. D., eighteen hundred and thirtyfive, eutitled "An Act to incorporate the proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn " - to the contrary notwithstanding; Provided always, that such real estate by the said Corporation so purchased, holden and possessed, as aforessid, under the pro-
visions of this Act, shall not, at any one time, exceed one hundred acres in extent, in addition to whatever the said Corporation now holds, or is entitled to hold, by virtue of the Act to which this Act is in addition as aforesaid.

Deputy Secretary of the Commonwealth.

At a meeting of the Trustees, on the 7th of July, 1856, the President, (Dr. Bigelow,) and Messrs. Crocker and Nazro were chosen a Committee to prepare, arrange and submit, in such form as they should deem advisable, all rules and standing rotes of the Corporation and Trustees ; and, on the $3 d$ of November, they presented the following Report, and a Code of By-Laws, which, after several meetings of the Trustees, for the consideration of the same, and the adoption of various amendments, were passed as a whole, January 5th, 1857, to which one or two additions have since been made.

The Committee appointed to prepare a Code of By-Laws respectfully Report :-

That with the assistance of the Secretary they have examined the records of the Corporation and Trustees, and have selected therefrom such standing votes as appeared to them to require incorporation into the proposed code of By-Laws. They have endeavored to arrange, condense and simplify said votes so as to make them intelligible and convenient of reference. They have omitted some things which appeared to them superfluous, and have introduced others which they considered essential to the connection and completeness of the code.

If the code now reported shall be adopted, they recommend that all previous votes incompatible with the provisions of said code, or with the Act of Incorporation, shall be ropealed, and that a copy of the new code shall be printed with the next edition of the Catalogue.

## B Y - L A W S .

Tire code of By-laws contains regulations for the most part additional to, or explanatory of, those contained in the Act of Incorporation.

## PROPRIETORS AND PRIVILEGES.

Art. 1. A proprietor holding not less than three hundred feet of land is a member of the Corporation, and, as such, is entitled to vote at meetings, and to hold a ticket admitting himself and his household to drive into the Cemetery. A proprietor holding less than three hundred feet is entitled to hold a like ticket of admission, but has not the right of voting.

## meETINGS.

Art 2. The annual meeting of the Corporation shall be held in Boston, after due notification, on the first Monday in February, in the afternoon. At this meeting, the report of the Trustees for the preceding year shall be read, also the reports of the Treasurer and Superintendent. The Trustees for the ensuing year shall be elected by ballot, and other business specified in the advertisement may be transacted. If the Secretary neglect duly to call the annual meeting, a special meeting shall be called in the manuer prescribed in the Act of Incorporation, and said special meeting shall be the annual meeting for the year in which it is held.

## TRUSTEES AND OFFICERS.

Arr. 3. The first meeting of the Trustees shall be called by the Secretary, and be held within two weeks after the annual meeting of the Corporation. At this meeting there shall be chosen by ballot, a President, Secretary, Treasurer, a Comnittec on Finance, a Committee on Lots, a Committec on Grounds, and a Committee on Regulations and Records of Interments, for the ensuing year. A Superintendent and Superintendent's Clerk, and a Gate-keeper, shall also be chosen by hand vote; and all salaries for the ensuing year shall be fixed. The Trustees shall meet at least once a month, and five Trustees shall constitute a quorum. No order of the Board, exeept to adjourn, shall be valid, unless it has received the votes of at least five Trustees.

The President shall eall a special meeting of the Board, whenever requested in writing so to do by five Trustees.

No Trustee shall receive any salary, contract, or other emolument, for services rendered by him, while holding the office of Trustee.

## PRESIDENT.

Art. 4. The President shall preside at meetings of the Corporation and of the Trustees; he shall fix the time and place for special meetings; he shall nominate all committees not otherwise provided for; and shall report in writing at the annual meeting the doings of the Trustees for the preceding year. In the absence of the President, his place shall be supplied by a temporary chairman.

## SECRETARY.

Art. 5. The Secretary shall notify and attend all mectings, and shall record the doings of the Corporation and of the Trustees. He shall prepare and superintend the advertisements

and other publications of the Trustees and Corporation. Ho shall prepare all legal instruments, and shall give legal opinions on all subjects required by the Thristecs. He shall have charge of the delivery of tickets, of eatalognes, and other publieations of the Trustees. Ho shall prepare, countersign and record, in a book kept for the purpose, all deeds of conveyance of land in the Cemetery, and shall insert and keep in a portfolio, all plans duly made of lots for proprietors, and shall number the same, and keep an index ly which they may conveniently be found.

The Secretary shall receive such salary as the Trustees may rote, together with the special fees designated for services to proprictors.

## IREASUMER.

Anr. 6. The 'Preasurer shall give bonds in the sum of three thousimd dollars for the faithful performane of the duties of his oftice. He shall have eustody of the fimeds of the Corporation, under the direction of the Trustees. Ho shall collect dues and pay bills approved by the President, or by the chairman of any committee duly anthorizing an expenditure. He shall keep the funds deposited in a bank to the eredit of the Corporation, and draw the samo as Treasurer. He shall sign all convoyances. He shall preserve and file all papers relating to his oflicial duties, and shall report at the ammal mecting the receipts and dishursements for the last year, and the existing state of the funds of the Corporation.

The compensation of the Treasurer shall consist in a commission on sales, to be fixed ammally ly the trustees.

## SUPERINTENDENT.

Asw. 7. The Superintendent shall reside near the Cemetery, and, under the direction of the Trustees, shall have the general earo and custody thereof; shall keep the avennes, paths, and
grounds in neat and satisfactory order ; and, as agent for the Trustees, shall have the sole power to engage and discharge workmen on the ground, also to order and arrange their respective duties, and to pay their wages not otherwise provided for. Ho shall see that the rights of the Corporation are respected by artists, mechanies, and laborers, employed on the ground by individual proprietors. He shall see that all regulations with regard to interments and the construction of tombs be duly complied with. He shall fulfil all contracts made with proprictors for the repair of lots, and perform such other duties as the Trustees may require. He shall have the power to remove from the Cemetery improper and disorderly persons, also to abate nuisances, and remove rubbish and unnecessary incumbrances. He shall keep, in books provided for the purpose, regular and accurate records of all interments, ineluding the names and ages of persons interred, and the place and date of their interment; also of all monuments erected, and lots inclosed, sodded, or otherwise improved; also of all moneys received or disbursed by him, whether for wages, fees, improvement of lots, sales of wood or other articles, purchases made or services rendered. On the first day of every month, or oftener if required by the Trustees, he shall render to the Treasurer copies of said accounts, with proper vouchers, and pay over to him all moneys remaining in his hands. The compensation of the Superintendent shall be a salary and the use of a house, with no other perquisites.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S CLERE.

Art. 8. The Superintendent's Clerk shall assist the Superintendent by keeping the books, and performing such other duties as the Superintendent may refuire, and as aro not incompatible with other duties required by the Trustees.

## GATE-KEEEPER.

Arr. 9. The Gate-keeper shall attend the gate from sumrise to sunset, overy day in tho week, and seo to the enforeement of the rules respecting admittance.

## COMMITTEES.

Art 10. Standing Committees shall be chosen by ballot; other Committees may be chosen by hand vote. Vacancies occurring in any committee shall be filled in the same manner as that in which said Committee was chosen, and vacancies in Standing Committees shall be filled at a meeting subsequent to that in which the vacancy is announced. No Committce shall expend more than one hundred dollars on any one olject, unless authorized so to do by vote of the Trustees.

COMMITTEE ON FINANCE.
Art. 11. The Committeo on Finance shall consist of two Trustees. They shall direct the Treasurer in regard to all sales and all investments of the funds of the Corporation not otherwise provided for, or any part of the same. They shall also act as auditors, and shall examine the 'Treasurer's accounts before each annual meeting, and satisfy themselves in regard to the correctness of said accounts, also in regarl to the safe preservation of all evidenees of property belonging to the Corporation ; and they shall amex their report to the annual report of the 'Treasurer.

## COMMITTEE ON LOTS.

Art. 12. The Committee on Lots shall consist of three Trustees. They shall have the general supervision of all sales, locations, and enlargements of lots, also of all questions of right between individual proprietors, or between proprietors and the

Corporation. No transfer or conveyance of land by the Corporation shall take place until it has received the approval, in writing, of a majority of the Committee on Lots. If an appeal to the Trustees is made by any party in interest, before the delivery of a deed, the Secretary shall delay acting until the ease has been brought before the Trustees, and acted upon by them. The Committee on Lots shall have power, subject to the concurrence of the Trustecs, to contract with any proprietor for the repair of his lot perpetually, or for an indefinite time. They shall at least twice in each year inspect the lots whieh the Trustees have undertaken to keep in repair, and see that the trust is duly executed.

COMMITTEE ON GROUNDS.
Arr. 13. The Committeo on Grounds shall consist of five Trustees. They shall have general charge of the grounds, trees, avenues, and paths in the Cemetery, with power to make such alterations, repairs and improvements therein, as they shall deem expedient. But no avenues or paths shall be changed in situation, without the consent of the Trustees expressed by vote.

COMMITTEE ON REGUIATIONS AND RECORDS OF INTERMENTS.

Art. 14. The Committee on Regulations and Records of Interments, shall consist of two Trustecs. They shall superintend the general subject of interments, and see that the laws of the Commonwealth and those of the Cemetery, in relation thereto, be complied with. They slall, from time to time, inspect the records and accounts of the Superintendent, and see that the same are suitably kept.

## INTERMENTS.

Art. 15. No interment shall be mate at Momet Auburn motil such a permit as may he required by the laws of the Commonwealth, of of the city or town from which the deceased may be bronght, tonether with an orter from the proprietor of the lot in which sach interment is to he made, or from his legal representative, slall have been presentel at the gate, nor mutil the fees slall have heen paid.

Until otherwiso ordered, fwo dollass and fitty cents shall tre charged for digrong a grave amd making an interment, and fitty cents additional for recording the same. A dednction of one dollar shatl be made from the above charges for a chikl mater ton years of age. For each interment in a tomb, a charge shall be mato by tho Superintendent, ateorling to the amount of service rentered in the case.

The particulars and amomes of fees for burial shall be printed on the lanek of the order from the proprietor, together with the words, "payable at the time of interment."

## 1.OTS AND SPACES.

Abr 16. Lots shall be laid out by the Superintendent, subjoct to the approval of the Committeo on Lots. In all fature sales of lots, a space of not less than thee nor more than six feet in width, at the diseretion of the Committeo on Lots, shall bo reserved between the timee limits of different lots, mbess otherwise ordered by vote of the Trustees.

The land left vacant as intermodiato space between lots in Mount Aubum, and not exceeding ten feet in width between any two lots, may he sold to the nearest lot hodder or holders, at whe thind of the selling prices per foot at the time of salid sale, with the condition that said land shall forever bo kept open and without interments: provided that, if the Committee on lots
deem it inexpedient in any special case to make such sale, the question may be submitted to the Board of Trustees.

The price of a full lot, until otherwise ordered, shall be one hundred and fifty dollars, or fifty cents per square foot. Enlarged lots, small lots, and land additional to lots, will be sold at a corresponding rate per foot. Choice lots in such places as the Thrnstees may designate, will be held at an advanced price.

No lots shall bo gratuitously conveyed to public bodies or private individuals.

## PUBLIC LOTS.

Ais 17. Interments may be made in the public lots belonging to the eemetery, and the graves numbered on stone, on payment of twelve dollars each, together with the eustomary fees payable in other cases of interment ; but no slab, monument, or fence shall be erected upon or around said graves without the approval of the Committee on Lots.

## SALES AND CONVEYANCES.

Aut. 18. Lots applied for by purchasers shall be laid out ly the Superintendent, sulject to the approval of the Committee on Lots. If the sale is approved by a majority of said Committee, the purchaser shall then pay to the Treasurer the enstomary or stipulated price of the lot sold him, and the Secretary's fee of one dollar, and receive a certifieate therefor. The Secretary, on receiving the Treasurer's order for the deed of said lot, shall make, record, and return said deed to the 'Treasurer, who will deliver the same to the purchaser, upon his presenting the certificate, and receipting for said deed. In any doubtful case the Secretary or 'Treasurer shall ask instruction from the 'Trustees before exceuting a deed.

No deed of any lot shall be issued to more than one grantee ; nor to any person as trustee, executor or administrator, except by the vote of the Trustees, or the authority of the Com-
mittee on Lots. No deed of any lot shall contain any special declaration of trust, without a vote of the Trustees therefor.

All deeds of conveyance by the Corporation shall be under the common seal, which shall be that heretofore adopted ; and signed by the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary and recorded in the books of the Corporation. One dollar shall be paid to the Secretary for recording any deed of transfer, and giving the due certificate of the same.

The forms of conveyance given in Appendix A, shall be used until otherwise ordered by the Trustees.

## LOTS OF DECEASED PROPRIETORS.

Art. 19. When the devisee of a deceased proprictor of any lot in the Cemetery shall desire to place upon the record of the deed of said lot, at the Secretary's office, the evidence of his title to the same, he may do so by producing a certified copy of the will of such proprietor, (if the title is dedueible therefrom,) or of such portion of said will as relates to said title ; and the same shall be duly recorded in a book lept for that purpose, and proper reference thereto bo made upon the margin of the original record. The Seeretary shall receive the affidavit of any person who shall claim to be the sole heir at law of the deceased proprietor of any lot, in which the material facts necessary to suppert such elaim shall be set forth, and he shall file the same with the papers of the corporation, with proper reference thereto, upon the margin of the original record.

When the devisces or heirs at law of any deceased proprietor, or the guardian or trustec of such persons being infants, shall desire the appointment of a person to represent the lot owned in common by them, written application to the Trustees shall be made by them, in that behalf.

## PLANS AND PORTFOLIOS.

Art. 20. $\Lambda$ large map or plan of the Cemetery shall be kept at the Secretary's office, and a duplicate of the same at the Superintendent's office. On these shall be entered, under the direction of the Committee on Lots, by a surveyor to be from time to time designated by them, all avenues and paths duly named, and all lots sold or laid out by the Corporation duly numbered. If any avenue, path or lot shall be given up, altered or removed by the Trustees, a corresponding alteration shall be made in the plan.

The Secretary shall procure and keep one or more portfolios, in which he shall insert such plans as proprietors may respectively procure to be made of their lots, such plans to be drawn by a surveyor approved by the Trustees, on paper of uniform size, which shall be furnished by the Sceretary, and no plans shall be introduced into the portfolio unless they shall have been examined and approved by the Committee on Lots, or a major. ity of them, and certified by the Superintendent to be correct. Proprietors shall pay the expense of their own plans, and one dollar to the Secretary for examining and introducing the same into the portfolio and placing the name in the index.

## TREES.

Art. 21. 'Trees standing within lots can be removed, if desired, by an application from the proprietor to the Superintendent, sulject to the approval of the Committee on Grounds. The Committee on Grounds lave likewiso charge of the general subject of introducing and cultivating, also of trimming and removing, trees and shrubs in other parts of the Cemetery.

> TOMBS.

Art. 22. Lots for tombs may be sold in places approved by the Trustees, and at prices fixed by them. Such tombs
shall be made in a strong, tight, and durable manner, and every part, including the door, shall be at least one foot under ground.

## RECEIVING TOMBS.

Art. 23. Bodies may be deposited in the reeeiving tombs on payment of fifteen dollars to the Superintendent. But if within four months after interment, the deposited body shall be remored to any part of Mount Auburn, ten dollars of the abore sum shall be refunded, otherwise the whole fifteen dollars shall bo forfeited to the Corporation ; and the Superintendent shall remove the body to such place as shall be direeted by the Committee on Grounds. But the friends or relatives, with the consent of the Superintendent, and in a legal way, may, at their own expense, remove said body from the Cemetery.

## monuments, stones, fences, ETC.

Art. 24. Proprietors have the right to erect on their lots, fences, monuments, and stones, of appropriate character. Wooden fences and grave-stones of slate are not permittel. Live hedges of small or moderate size are allowed.

## APPROPRLATIONS.

Alit. 25. No appropriation of money exceeding one thousand dollars for any one object, unless it be for the liquidation of a debt previously existing, shall be made by the Trustees, exeept at a meeting at least seven days subsequent to the meeting in which tho said appropriation has been moved; whereof special notice shall have been given.

> REPAIR FUND.

Art. 26. The Trustees will receive in trust from any propriotor, a sum of money not less than one hundred dollars, the
income of whieh shall be appropriated to the repair of his lot, according to the terms of trust given in Appendix B.

The Trustees may also guarantee the perpetual repair of lots, on the payment to the Treasurer of a sum not less than three bundred dollars, according to the terms of trust given in Appendix C. In this ease, if the Repair Fund should ever be lost, the whole property of the Corporation is held for the perpetual repair of sueh lots.

All monies received from proprietors, for the purpose of keeping lots in repair, shall collectively constitute a separate fund, to be called the "Repair Fund," and shall he kept invested, under the direction of the Committee on Finance, in some public stoek of this State, or of the National Government, or in the stock of some bank or banks of this State, or in some personal notes or obligations of private persons, secured by a satisfaetory collateral pledge, or mortgage on interest.

Lach lot, in relation to which sueh contract shall have been made, shall be credited in a book kept for the purpose, with the prineipal sum given on account of said lot, and at the close of each year, a ratable proportion of the net income of the whole repair fund, less one half per cent., shall be carried to the credit of each lot, and the proper entries made accordingly.

The Treasurer shall keep the Superintendent constantly informed as to all lots which the Corporation have agreed to keep in repair, and shall also state the sums paid by the proprietors as consideration for sueh agreements.

A list of the lots, the repair of which has been contracted for by the Corporation, shall be published in each edition of the Catalogue of Proprietors, together with the names of the present owners, and the sums respectively paid on said lots.

## ADMITTANCE.

Art. 27. The Seeretary shall furnish to each proprietor who may request it, a tieket, entitling him and his household to drive with a carriage into the Cemetery. These tickets are not transferable.

In all eases where the Secretary is satisfied, by a written petition to the Trustees, that the heirs or devisees in common of any lot have agreed upon any one person to represent the same, be may issue the tieket for such lot to the person designated in such petition as representative of such lot, to remain good until the further aetion of the Board. The petition, however, shall be presented, with notice of the Secretary's aetion, at the next mecting of the Trustees.

The Secretary is authorized to issue more than one tieket upon one lot, where he is satisfied that two or more persons are actual owners of a lot in faet, though the title is in the name of one only.

The Seeretary is authorized to replace tiekets whieh he is satisfied are actually lost. But if the lost ticket is found, the duplieate shall be returned to the Secretary.

Strangers from a distance, also persons having business in the Cemetery, may be admitted with carriages on presenting a note or ticket of admission signed by a Trustee or by the Secretary or Treasurer. The Trustecs, however, may from time to time pass such votes for the admission of strangers and other nonproprietors, and under such regulations as they may deem expedient.

The public are, at present, allowed to walk into the Cemetery, exeept on Sundays and holidays. Persons having a relative or near friend interred there, may enter the Cemetery on Sundays and holidays, on presenting a card of admission from a Trustee, the Secretary, or Treasurer. All visitors are subject to the conditions and regulations preseribed in the by-laws.

Teams, carts, and heavy loaded vehicles are not allowed to enter the front gate without the order of a Trustee. No omnibuses are allowed to enter the Cemetery.

The rules and regulations concerning visitors to the Cemetery shall be as given in Appendix D, until otherwise ordered by the Trustees.

## funerals.

Art. 28. Early notice of funerals should be given to the Superintendent on the ground at Mount Auburn. When a funeral arrives, a person will be in readiness at the gate to conduet the procession to the place of interment. If military funerals on foot or on horseback are admitted, no music nor firing of volleys will be allowed within the Cemetery.

## ALTERATIONS OF BY-LAWS.

Art. 29. No alteration nor addition shall be made in any of the By-laws, unless the proposed alteration or addition shall have been submitted to the Trustees at a meeting at least seven days previous to the meeting at which it is to be acted upon.

## APPENDIX A.

## FORM FOL CONVEYANCE OF LOTS.

KNOW ALL MEN BY TIEESE PRESENTS, That the Proprietors of the Cemetcry of Mount Auburn, in consideration of doliars, paid to them by of the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said and heirs and assigns, one lot of land in the Cemetery of Mount Auburn, in the County of Middlesex, situated on the way ealled and numbered, on the plan of said Cemetery, which plan is in the possession of the said Corporation, for inspection by the said grantee, heirs and assigus, at all seasonable times, the said lot of land containing superficial square feet.

To have and to hold the aforegranted premises unto the said heirs and assigns, forever; subject, however, to the couditions and limitations, and with the privileges following, to wit:

First, That the proprietor of the said lot shall have the right to enclose the same, with a wall or fence not exceeding oue foot in thickness, which may be placed on the adjoining land of the Corporation, exterior to the said lot;

Second, That the said lot of land shall not be used for any other purpose than as a place of burial for the dead; and no trees within the lot or border, shall be eut down or destroyed, without the consent of the Trustees of the said Corporation;

Third, That the proprietor of the said lot shall have the right to erect stones, monuments or sepulchral structnres, and to cultivate trees, shrubs and plants in the same.

Fourth, The proprietor of the said lot of land shall erect, at his or her own expense, suitable landmarks of stone or iron, at the corners thereof; and shall also canse the number thereof to be legibly and permanently marked on the premises. And if the said proprictor shall omit, for thirty days after notice, to ereet such landuarks, and mark the number, the Trustees shall have authority to canse the same to be done at the expense of the said proprietor.

Fifth, That if the landmarks and boundaries of the said lot shall be effaced, so that the said lot camnot, with reasonable diligenee, be found and identified, the said Trustees shall set off to the said grantee, heirs or assigns, a lot in lieu thereof, in such part of the Cemetery as they see fit, and the lot hereby granted shall, in such case, revert to the Corporation;

Sixcth, That if any trees or shrubs situated in said lot of land shall, by means of their roots, branches or otherwise, become detrimental to the adjacent lots or avenues, or dangerous or inconvenient to passengers, it shall be the duty of the said Trustees, for the time being, and they shall have the right, to enter into the said lot and remove the said trees and shrubs, or such parts thereof as aro thus detrimental, dangerous or inconvenient;

Secenth, That if any monument or effigy, or any structure whatever, or any inseription be placed in or upon the said land, which shall be determined by the major part of the said Trustees for the time being, to be offensive or improper, the said Trustees, or the major part of them, shall have the right, and it shall be their duty, to enter upon said land, and remove the said offensive or improper object or objects.

Eighth, No fence shall, from time to time or at any time, be placed or erected in or around the said lot, the materials and design of which shall not first have been approved by the 'Trustees, or a committee of them.

Ninth, No tomb slall be constructed within the bounds of the Cemetery, except in or upon the lots situated in such parts of the grounds as shall be designated by the Trustees for tbat purpose; and no proprictor shall suffer the remains of any person to be deposited in a tomb so authorized, for hire.

Tenth, The said lot of land shall be holden subject to the provisions contained in an aet of the General Court, dated Mareh 31, 1835, and entitled "An Act to incorporate the Iroprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn."

And the said Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn do hereby covenant to and with the said
heirs and assigns, that they are lawfully seized of the aforegrauted premises, and of the ways leading to the same from the highway, in fee simple; that they are free from all incumbrances; that the Corporation have a right to sell and convey the said premises to the said
for the purposes above expressed; and that they will warrant and defend the same unto the said heirs and assigns forever.

And the said Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn further covenant to and with the snid heirs and assigns, that the provisions of an order passed by the Trustces of this Corporation, on the sixth day of April, in the year eighteen hundred and fifty seven, (which is made part of this covenant, as if herein repeated,) for the establishment and security of a fund for the preservation of the Cemetery and
its appurtenances, shall be forever kept, observed and performed by the said Corporation.

Secondly,-To suffer the surplus, if any, of such income or interest to accumulate for such time as the said Trustees may deem expedient, or in their discretion to apply the same surplus, or any part thereof, from time to time, to the ornament and preservation of the grounds of the said Ceme-
tery, or to any other, or all the purposes to which, by the Act of Incorporstion, the funds of the said Corporation may be lawfully applied, and which are appropriate to the objects of the establishment of said Cemetery.

## APPENDIX D.

## REGULATIONS CONCERNING VISITORS TO THE CEMETERY.

The gates are opened at suurise, and closed at sunset.
No money is to be paid to the gatekeeper.
No persons are admitted on Sundays or Holidays, except Proprierors and nembers of their llousenold, and persons accompanying them.

No refreshments, and no party carrying refreshments, will be admitted to come within the grounds at Mount Anburn.

All persons who shall be found within the grounds making unseemly noises, or otherwise conducting themselves unsuitably to the purposes to which the grounds are devoted, will be required instantly to leave the grounds, and upon refusal will be compelled to do so ; such persons will also be prosecuted.

No vehicle is to be driven, in the Cemetery, at a rate faster than a walk.
No horse is to be left unfastened without a keeper.
No horse is to be fastened, except at the posts provided for this purpose.
All persons are prohibited from gathering any flowers, either wild or cultivated, or breaking any tree, shrub or plast.

Any person who shall be found in possession of flowers or shrubs, while in the grounds or before leaving them, will be deemed to have unlawfully taken them in the grounds, and will be prosecuted accordingly. N. B.-Persons earrying flowers into the Cemetery, to be placed on any lot or grave, as offerings or memorials, are requested to notify the Gatekeeper, as they pass in ; in every other case flowers brought to the Cemetery must be left without the gate, or with the Gatekeeper, until the owner passes out again.

All persons are prohibited from writing upon, defacing and injuring any monument, fenee, or other structure, in or belonging to the Cemetery.

All persons are prohibited from diseharging fire-arms in the Cemetery.
The Superintendent, the Gatekeeper, and any other person aeting under them, shall have a right to require his or her name from any person other than a proprictor, or a member of his family, who shall visit the grounds, and upon his or her refusal, or giving a false name, to exclude them from the grounds.

The Superintendent, the Gatekeeper, and all other persons acting under them, shall have full authority to earry these regulations into eflect, and shall give notice of any violations thereof to the Trustees.
$[\mathcal{F}$ The Superintendent has the care of the Cemetery, and is authorized to remove all those who violate these regulations, or commit trespasses. Trespassers are also liable to be fined Fifty Dollars.
[ $\mathrm{F}^{\longrightarrow}$ Twenty Dollaks reward is offered to any person who shall give information to the Trustees, which shall lead to the convietion of the offender, of any trespass done by taking or plucking any flowers, shrubs, or trees, within the grounds, or of otherwise injuring the grounds, or of any other offence against the laws and regulations provided for the protectiou of the Cemetery, and the monuments and erections therein.

## REPORT

## OF

## THE COMMITTEE UPON THE ACCUMULATING FUND FOR

 THE PRESERVATION OF THE CEMETERY.This Committee, consisting of Messrs. Curtis, Little and Nazro, were originally appointed in April, 1856, and a plan was reported by a majority of the Committee in January, 1857, and the same was adopted.

At the meeting in February following, the whole subject was re-opened for the purpose of making some more effectual provision to ensure the safety of said fund, and was referred to the same Comnittee in the following terms: "To consider and report upon a plan for securing the preservation and continuance of the fund which has been ordered to be established, for the perpetual care and preservation of the Cemetery and its appurtenances ; and also to report such regulations for the investment and use of the said fund as they may deem expedient."

A report, with the orders accompanying, was presented by a majority of the Committee, April 6,1857, and on the same day was adopted by the Board of Trustees, and is as follows:

The undersigned, the majority of the Committee appointed to report a plan for ensuring the preservation and continuanee of the accumulating fund, have considered the subject and ask leave to report:

That they find that the establishment of the said fund is an aet generally received with favor by the proprietors whom they bave conferred with; and they have no doubt that it will be universally approved, when it is known that by it the future prosperity of the Cemetery will be secured. With a view to this end, your Committee have taken into consideration the
means of securing the perpetual preservation of this safety fund ; and after consulting some of the most sagacious proprietors, they have come to the conclusion to recommend the adoption of an order by the Trustees, - that in all the deeds of lots which shall hereafter be issued, there be inserted a covenant, that this fund shall be increased by yearly additions and by the accumulation of the interest, until it reaches the sum of one bundred and fifty thousand dollars ; when the interest, and that alone, may be applied, if the wants of the corporation require it, to the payment of the expenses of the Cemetery. If the Trustees in office at that time shall not need the income of this fund for expenses, they can, if they see fit, permit it to aecumulate still longer.

In order to carry this design into effeet, it will be expedient to amend the proposition adopted January 5th, 1857, by proviling, that instead of placing the income at the disposal of the officers, at the end of twenty years, it shall not be made use of until the accumulated capital shall amount to the sum before mentioned, namely, one hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

With these views, your Committee recommend the passage of the following orders.

> CHARLES P. CURTIS, CHARLES C. LITTLE.

It is ordered, by the Trustees of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn, that in the month of December of each year, the Treasurer of the Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn shall deposit with the Massachusetts Hospital Life Insurance Company, if they will receive it on as favorable conditions as other deposits, in trust for the said Proprietors, a sum equal to one fifth part of the gross proceeds of the lots and parts of lots and intermediate spaces between lots, which shall bave been sold subsequently to the first day of December, in the year preceding ; the interest of which sums shall, annually or oftener,
be added to the capital, for the purpose and upon the principle of accumulation, until the whole of said deposits, with the accumulated interest, shall amount to one hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

And when the said fund shall bave amounted to the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, it shall be lawful for the Trustees, if they see fit, to withdraw the income thereof, and appropriate the same to the care, preservation, and keeping in order of the Cemetery and its appurtenances, to the payment of the salaries, and to the other necessary expenses of the institution ; and by vote of four-fifths of the Trustees for the time being, they may withdraw, from time to time, the principal of the said fund, and invest the same as hereinafter is prescribed.

If, at any time, the Trustees shall deem the Massachusetts Hospital Life Insurance Company to be an unsafe place of deposit of the said fund, and shall, by a rote of a majority of all the members of the boarl so declare of record, the said fund may be withdrawn from the custody of the said Insurance Company, as soon as by the conditions of the deposit it may be, and shall then be invested in the name of the Proprictors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn, upon the same trusts, in the public debt of the United States, or in that of the State of Massachusetts, or in the delbt of the City of Buston, or the City of Charlestorn, or the City of Rosbury, or the City of Cambridge, or in mortgages of real estate in Boston : provided that no mortgage shall be taken for a sum exceeding two-thirds of the value of the estate as it stands, when taken, on the valuation books of the assessors of the city taxes ; nor for a period exceeding five sears ; nor in which the interest shall not be payable as often as annually; to which shall be added insurance against fire by some competent insurance company in Boston, for the amount of the loan, or such proportion thereof as the value of the buildings on the land shall enable the owner to obtain; which insurance shall be renewed from time to time at the expense of the mortgagor and
his assigns, and shall be payable, in case of loss, to the Trustees of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn.

It is ordered, that in all the deeds which shall hereafter be issued, to the purchasers of lots, parts of lots, or other pareels of land in the Cemetery, the following covenant shall be inserted :
" And the said Proprietors of the Cemetery of Mount Auburn further covenant to and with the said heirs and assigns, that the Provisions of an order passed by the Trustees of this Corporation, on the sixth day of April, in the year cighteen hundred and fifty-seven, (which is made part of this covenant, as if herein repeated,) for the establishment and security of a fund for the preservation of the Cemetery and its appurtenances, shall be forever kept, observed, and performed by the said Corporation."
