INTRODUCTION

Specimens of the Silversmith's art of the Georgian period were greatly prized by their first owners, but today their appreciation is well nigh universal, and their subtle charm for collectors is gathering force as the years go by.

Incidentally, besides the captivation of the intrinsic workmanship and of the beautiful designs, the gradual increase in value of this fine old silver appeals strongly to the thrifty.

The Eighteenth Century in England produced wonderful craftsmen in many of the arts, but the silversmith of that age seemed to have an intuitive knowledge of the wants of his elegant patrons and fashioned especially for household use charming simple table ware that probably will never be surpassed for its purpose.

Even the very elaborate pieces have a fine restraint that enhances their beautiful lines and modelling. The numerous specimens that were skilfully engraved with slight dainty bandings and motives invariably charm and hold one's interest, so that one looks forward with pleasure to seeing those friendly companions again.

The collection contains many rare items of obvious beauty that are worthy of very careful attention.
