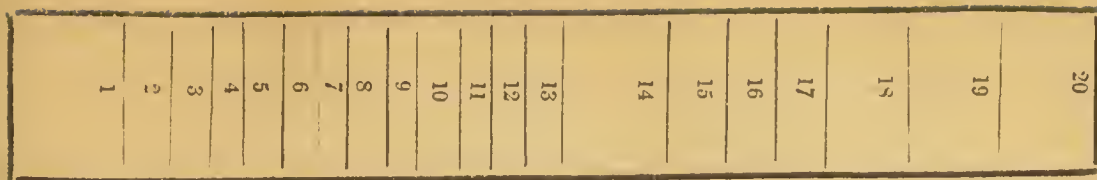
CONDITIONS OF SALE.
