- 20 *A beautiful needle-work sliding screen, with shipping, flowers, and various trophies, on a white satin ground, ornamented with gold and silver, and rich carved and gilt ornamented frame*

- 21 Eight cabriole elbow chairs, stuffed in fine canvass, and blue stormont cotton cases
- 22 Four large elbow ditto, on casters, with hair cushions in canvass, and blue stormont cotton cases
- 23 A cabriole sofa, with down squab and 2 cushions in canvass, and blue stormont cotton cases
- 24 Six neat mahogany chairs, with stuffed seats, covered with green Morocco leather, and bound with gold twist
- 25 A pair of mahogany pier tables, 6 feet long, with elliptic fronts, to join, made of good wood

- 5 *A handsome Barree coloured silk taberay counterpane, with drapery borders, neatly fringed and ornamented, and 2 bolster cases to correspond*
- 6 *A pair of rich Barree coloured silk taberay drapery head valens and handsome carved cornices, finished in white and gold*
- 7 *Six elegant cabriole elbow chairs stuffed and covered with rich Barree coloured silk taberay, the frames expensively carved and finished in white and gold, to correspond*
- 8 *A handsome cabriole sofa stuffed and covered with silk taberay, and 2 pillows, the frame finished in white and gold, to correspond with the preceding lot*
- 9 *A pier glass of an excellent colour, size 94 by 53, in a rich carved and gilt ornamented frame, in perfect condition*
