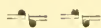

# CENSUS OF EAST LIVERMORE

---

The population of the town of East Livermore has been arranged herewith in families where that arrangement has been possible. In these families, in addition to the resident living members, the names of the non-resident members are included. It should be borne in mind that this plan does not include the names of all former residents of the town of East Livermore, as the names of the non-residents appear only when one or both the parents are still living in town. At the end of the Census will be found the names of the non-residents with their present addresses, when such addresses have been given to us. The non residents are indicated by the (\*).

Following the names of the population is the occupation. To designate the occupations we have used the more common abbreviations and contractions. Some of these follow: Farmer—far; carpenter—car; railroad service—R R ser; student, a member of an advanced institution of learning—stu; pupil, a member of a lower grade of schools—pl; housework—ho; laborer—lab; physician and surgeon—phy & sur; clergyman—clerg; merchant—mer; teacher—tr; blacksmith—blk; clerk—cl; book-keeper—bk kpr.

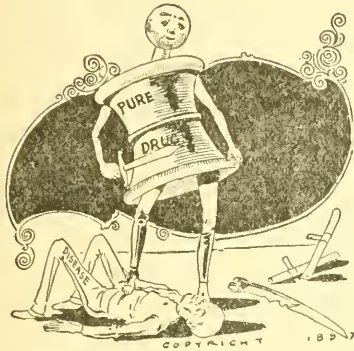

## Early Settlement

Any attempt to compile a history of the towns of Livermore and East Livermore necessitates the covering much of the same ground two different times if we compile the history separately. Recognizing this fact, due to the conditions which have been formed by the civil actions during the history of these two towns we have concluded to gather in our necessarily brief space the more important historical events into one account.

We find that these two towns situated on opposite sides of the Androscoggin river twenty miles north of Lewiston and twenty-five miles west of Augusta, in a region well favored for agricultural purposes and for manufacturing industries as well, have a story of interest covering a period of one hundred and twenty-four years.

Like so many towns in this state the original town of Livermore was conveyed as a grant of land to certain proprietors for meritorious services in the French and Indian Wars. Nathaniel Harris and others were granted by the General Court of Massachusetts township No. 2 "on the east side adjoining the Connecticut River" for services in reducing Port Royal. The first meeting of these proprietors was held at the inn of one Isaac Baldwin of Weston, Mass., on January 28, 1737. A few years previous to the settlement of the town of Livermore it was determined that the territory of the township granted as above, fell within the bounds of the state of New Hampshire. In 1770 a committee of the proprietors, consisting of Major Elijah Livermore, Dr. Leonard Williams, and George Babcock was appointed to petition the General Court of Massachusetts to obtain another grant of land. This petition was granted and a town of the contents of six and three quarters square miles in some of the unappropriated lands in the province of Massachusetts Bay, to the eastward of Saco River, and adjoining some former grant on the condition that the proprietors settle sixty families in said town in seven years, build a house for the public worship of God, settle a learned Protestant minister, and lay out one sixty-fourth part for the first settled minister, one sixty-fourth part for the ministry, one sixty-fourth for the use of schools, and one sixty-fourth part for the use of Harvard College.

On the ninth day of August, 1771, Elijah Livermore and Elisha Harrington were instructed to explore

the country thus granted. They were "to take a boat and pilot at Brunswick Falls and proceed up the river as far as Rocky-Mico." According to their report the grant was located adjoining Sylvester, as the town of Turner was called, on both sides of the Androscoggin, and contained the amount of 30,220 acres. When the land was surveyed in the autumn of 1772 it was found that there was a lack of land to fill the grant. Thereupon there was another petition presented for additional land to complete the amount they were to receive from the State. Provisions were soon made for roads in crude form from this town to Turner. The breaking out of the Revolutionary War hindered the improvements begun by the proprietors and no settlements were attempted till 1779. At this time Elijah Livermore and Major Thomas Fish came as permanent settlers. They were soon joined by Josiah Wyer, Elisha Smith, and Mrs. Carver. From this time on, the settlement of the town was rapid. We shall attempt to trace briefly and as accurately as the records will allow the settlers who came into this town from 1779 to about the close of the century.

No man among the early comers to Livermore is more deserving of special mention than is Deacon Elijah Livermore. He was the first settler, a son of one of the proprietors of the township. He was born in Waltham, Mass., and on his father's demise he inherited the family homestead. He was much in town office and was the first representative to the General Court of

Massachusetts, being unanimously elected. We are told that he made the journey to Boston to take his seat in the General Court on horseback wearing a cocked hat, knee breeches and a ruffled shirt. He died August 5, 1808, and was mourned by the whole community, as their foremost and best beloved citizen.

Major Thomas Fish was another prominent character among the early settlers, and is given the honor of being the first settler. He won his title in the Revolution, where he was a brave soldier. He moved to Livermore with Deacon Livermore in 1779 and settled at "Fish Meadow." His wife died while he was perfecting plans to bring her to his back woods home. He was engaged to Miss Betsey Marrow of Winthrop some years later. While he was attempting to make the journey from Winthrop to Livermore, one cold, stormy day in January, he became unable to proceed upon his way and was frozen to death. He was found near an elm tree on the intervale where Deacon Livermore lived. His loss was also keenly felt, as he was an excellent surveyor, and a man of wonderful ingenuity and capable of filling many needs in a new country.

The third settler was Josiah Wyer, born at Watertown, Mass., in 1849 and settled in Livermore in 1779. His wife was Rebecca Brackett of Falmouth whom he married in 1782. His place in Livermore was located on the road leading from the old Methodist meeting house to North Turner. His death occurred on July 7, 1827.

The fourth man to find a home in this town was Lieut. Samuel Benjamin. He was also a soldier of the Revolution, and his record was one of honor to himself and to his town. He was pensioned by special act of Congress and placed on half-pay for the remainder of his life, for the gallant services he had performed. He settled here in 1782 on land west of Long Pond. He was often a town official, and valuable man in the community. He reared a distinguished family of children.

Elisha Smith was probably the next settler. He came from Martha's Vineyard about the year 1780 and located on the farm later called the Rev. Thomas Wyman farm. Reuben Wing was another of the early ones. He was a noted Bible scholar. He died in 1862.

Another Revolutionary soldier of note to choose Livermore for a home was Daniel Holman, who was a Corporal in the Revolutionary army. More than that he was one of the immortal band of Minute Men who marched to Concord, April 19, 1775. He settled in North Livermore, and reared a large family of children who won enviable records in their various walks of life.

Elijah Fisher was a soldier of the Revolution, being a member of Washington's Life guard. He was engaged in the Battle of Bunker Hill when his seventeenth birthday occurred. He was born in Norton, Mass. He settled in this town not far from 1789

on a farm south of the Strickland place. His death occurred in 1842. The Delano Brothers, Ebenezer, James, Zebedee, and Jabez were here at an early date, at just what time we are unable to state. James settled on the David Rich place; Zebedee settled on the Thomas Chase farm; Ebenezer settled in the west part; and Jabez lived in the east part of the town now East Livermore. John Walker who was in the Quebec expedition of 1775 settled here at an early date. Deacon Peletiah Gibbs came to this town in the early years and took up and cleared the farm where Ebenezer Hinds later lived. Henry Grevey who was one of the hired soldiers of Britain in the Revolution, a Hessian, settled here on a place near Mr. Benjamin's above mentioned.

Another of the men who came out from Massachusetts to the district of Maine and settled in Livermore was General David Learned of Oxford, Mass. To General Learned belongs the honor of naming Oxford County. He was proprietor of the first store in town, situated just south of the Norlands. General Learned was well qualified for the position of sheriff of the new county to which he was called after the erection of the Oxford having seen service in the war which had recently closed. He was here in Livermore previous to 1790, and soon came into prominence, holding the highest offices in the gift of his townsmen. He was a representative to the General Court at Boston. He died in Livermore in 1811 in the prime of life aged 44 years.



Henry Bond of Watertown came here in 1790, and assumed a half interest in the mills built by Deacon Livermore. He was also from a distinguished family, his father being one of the commanders at Bunker Hill. Mr. Bond was a deacon of the church, the second in town.

Thomas Coolidge settled in the west part of the town in the year 1790, coming from Cambridge, Mass. He was an excellent and well-to-do farmer and orchardist. He died in 1834. His sons Elisha, Daniel and Thomas were all substantial citizens.

Joseph Coolidge came here from Waltham, Mass., in 1790 and remained nearly a decade, occupying a place of influence in the community. Sylvester Norton of Martha's Vineyard came here in 1789 with three sons Ransom, James and Zebulon, all of whom filled places of usefulness in their different spheres. Samuel Hillman, who became a Methodist preacher, came here in 1788, and occupied a large place in the confidence of the people of the community. Moses Hillman a brother came here in 1817, and settled on the intervalle. Isaac Lovewell came here from Weston, Mass., in 1790 or before. He was a well known man, having a fine farm and orchard on Lovewell's Hill. He was a prominent member of the Baptist Church, contributing largely to its support.

The year 1790 brought to Livermore Abijah, John and Abel Monroe, three men who were destined to be among the leading men of the town. Abijah was the

first tavern keeper, his house being near Sander's Corner. John was a farmer and died at the age of 92 years. Abel was also a farmer a man of much intelligence and has been remembered particularly for his quickness at repartee. Jonathan Gooding came here in 1790 from Waltham, Mass., and settled in the northern part of the town of Livermore as it is now known. This same year Thomas Chase came here from Martha's Vineyard. His wife was Desire Luce. Mr. Chase was one of the men who were with John Paul Jones, the wonderful naval commander of the Colonies in Revolutionary times. Captain Tristram Chase, a brother of Thomas, settled on the west side of Long Pond. Abial, Epraim and John Turner were early settlers here. Deacon Sarson Chase was another settler of early years. His place was on the north side of Lovewell's Hill. He was a shoemaker. Samuel Swain, of Watertown, Mass., a Revolutionary soldier came here in 1788, and soon after his brother, Abijah, also came to this town.

In 1791 Ebenezer Pitts came here from Ward, Mass., and settled on a farm near the corner. The year 1795 brought Hastings Strickland of Nottingham, N. H. He was a prominent man, living on a large farm south of Munroe's hotel. His children have attained much prominence in the state in various lines of work.

In 1798 near the Turner line Nathaniel Perley made a settlement. This family has always been one

of the best in Livermore noted for the intelligence and high character of its population. Deacon Ira Thompson came here in 1803, and was a very prominent farmer, and an able and faithful member of the First Baptist Church.

Captain Simon Waters of Sutton, Mass., settled here in 1802, and at once became a prominent man and was much in town office and also served nine years in the Massachusetts Legislature.

Probably the most noted and prominent family that has lived in Livermore and has been a part of the town of Livermore from the first is the Washburn family, known the country over. The first of the name to settle in this town was Israel Washburn, born at Raynham, and coming to Livermore from Richmond where he was a shipbuilder for some years after coming to Maine. His father was a soldier of the Revolution. He came to this town in 1809, buying the place known to so many people far and near as the "Norlands," and installed himself as a trader. He was a prominent man in the affairs of the town and reared a large family which have gone out to win laurels in many states, in many lines. His wife, Martha Benjamin, was a woman of rare intelligence and of the strongest character. Her wonderful influence was felt over a wide circle and especially did her influence have its effects on the family of children that she reared and sent out to command the attention of the best and ablest minds in the United States. Their

children were Israel, Elihu B., Cadwalader C., Martha, Charles A., Samuel B., Mary, William D., and Caroline A.

Any special mention of these many-time honored names seems useless, and the name of Washburn is known alike, in the east and in the west, at the north and south, in state legislatures, and in the high courts, in the military and naval service, in the United States Congress, in Governors chairs, in the cabinets of Presidents of the United States, and last but in no respect least, very prominently in the industrial development of the west, "The Grainary of the World."

We learn that the first farm cleared in the part of Livermore known as East Livermore was cleared by a Mr. Cooledge on the northwestern side of Moose Hill. He soon sold to Phillip Smith who resided here till his death which occurred at the advanced age of ninety. We are told that the second town cleared was near the Wayne line, and was cleared at about 1780 by a Mr. Grevey, and though the records conflict to a certain degree, we are inclined to the belief that this man is the same as previously mentioned, viz., Henry Grevey, the Hessian soldier in the Revolution. The above account includes the names of the settlers in the original town of Livermore down to about the close of the eighteenth century. In addition to the foregoing are the names given in the following list of settlers in the early part of the nineteenth century. This list contains the names of many valuable additions to the newly

established community: Naphtali Coffin, Asa Bartlett, Thomas Rich, David Rich, Jacob Bemis, Jesse Kidder, George Chandler, Col. Josiah Hobbs, Benjamin Winslow, Perez Ellis, James Timberlake, Solomon Edes, Captain Charles J. Baker, Isaac Fuller, Ichabod Boothby, Thomas Bryant, Hezekiah Bryant, Isaac Hamlin, Samuel Beals, David Whitman, Elisha Chenry, William Thompson, Rufus Hewett, James Walker, Ebenezer Hinds Jr., Isaiah Keith, Apollos Jones, Stacy Knox, J. Basford, Henry Hersey, Eben Keith, Deacon John Elliott, Deacon Benjamin True, Daniel Briggs, John Bigelow, Col. Bartholomew Woodbury, Ephraim Childs, David Reed, John Sanders, Peter Humphrey, Joshua Campbell, Col. William Morrison, Robert Morrison, James Morrison, Samuel Morrison, Lieut. Israel Paul, Benjamin Edgecomb, Daniel Edgecomb, Didymus Edgecomb, Joseph Meserve, Joseph Merrill.

It is not our purpose to further trace the history of these sturdy men and women except as they appear in connection with the events that call our attention in the past of these two towns. But as we leave them in the phase of the pioneer, our admiration for their rugged character, their indomitable courage, their wonderful industry, and above all, their highly reverent spirit calls out our humble tribute in the words of a previous writer, "They took nature for a guide, they lived with nature, and their character was formed to imitate it. The woods was their home, and who can live in the grand old forests of Maine without having

instilled in them the grand ideas, the grand majestic principles by which our ancestors were actuated and guided. Their works shall prove them and now long after they are dead and gone from among us and even shall have been forgotten, their lives, dedicated to the work which they did, and stamped with an individual stamp which can never be erased, will ever continue to bear fruit.

### **Incorporation**

The first town meeting was held April 13, 1795, at the house of Deacon Elijah Livermore. Samuel Hillman was chosen town clerk and treasurer; David Learned, Sylvanus Boardman, and Peletiah Gibbs, selectmen; Peletiah Gibbs, constable; James Norton, Elisha Smith, William Lindsey, David Morse, Samuel Swain, Reuben Wing, Abraham Fuller, surveyors of roads; Thomas Chase, David Morse, Elijah Stevens, surveyors of lumber; Ransom Norton, scaler of weights and measures; Thomas Chase, and Isaac Lovewell, fence viewers; Elijah Stevens and Abijah Munroe, hog-reeves; and James Delano, pound keeper.

July 28, £50 were voted for roads, £40 for schools, £45 for the poor, paying town officers, and other charges. Elisha Williams, Samuel Benjamin, and Ransom Norton were chosen to form school districts. Roads were accepted from Turner, from Jay to Fayette, from

E. Stephen's Ferry, from Deacon Livermore's to New Sandwich, from the road to Turner's Mills to Chase Mills, from the Turner road to Chase Mills, from Littleborough to Benjamin's Mills, from Samuel Sawin's towards Fuller's and Learnard's Ferry, and from Turner road towards Deacon Livermore's 1796.

January 11, Sylvanus Boardman was chosen delegate to vote against the division of the county of Cumberland. This meeting was held at a school-house.

March 7, Thomas Chase, Samuel Benjamin and David Morse were chosen school wards. Voted that the east side of the river be a school district, and that Nezer Daile, Nathaniel Perley, Ransom Norton, Thomas Cooledge, Samuel Benjamin and Thomas Wing divide the west side into six districts.

April 4, first election of State officers. Increase Sumner received all the forty votes cast for governor.

May 10, 1797 voted unanimously to ask for the separation of the district of Maine.

November 5, voted to petition the General Court to divide Livermore into two towns, and make the the river dividing line between the counties of Cumberland and Lincoln.

September 29, 1801, Cyrus Hamlin was chosen delegate to a convention at Paris to consider the propriety of erecting a separate county.

In March, voted to be annexed to the county of Kennebec if disunited from Cumberland.

David Learnard, Elijah Livermore, and Jesse

Stone were chosen a committee to petition to sell the ministerial and parsonage lands.

May 6, voted to give twenty-five cents for crows heads this year.

November 25, voted, Col. David Learned to remonstrate against dividing the county into "half shiers."

April 6, 1807, eighty-three votes were cast in favor of the erection of Maine into a separate state, and fifty-four against.

October 2, voted to raise \$150 for military stores, and to build a powder house of brick and stone on the Isaac Lovell nook.

March 6, 1815, the selectmen were instructed to procure cartridges and balls sufficient for training all the soldiers in town and deposit them in the magazine prior to the first Tuesday in May next, and give notice thereof to the several commanders and companies.

In 1816. Yeas, 124; nays, 20; on the separation of Maine. Benjamin Bradford and William H. Bretun were chosen delegates to a convention at Brunswick concerning the separation.

July 26, 1819, voted that the selectmen agree with the several ferrymen to ferry the voters on the east side of the river at the expense of the town when going to and from town meetings.

September 20, Benjamin Bradford and Thomas Chase Jr., were chosen delegates to the constitutional convention at Portland.



December 20, Livermore cast seventy-six votes for the adoption of the constitution, and two against it.

April 3, 1820, William King had 111 votes for the first governor of Maine, Mark D. Hill, 15; John Howard, 4; Ezekiel Whitman, Merchant Philbrick and Thomas Chase Jr., 1 each.

September 9, 1822, William H. Brettun and son, Samuel Morrison, Israel Washburn, Davis Washburn, Elisha Pettingill, John S. Stone, Abijah Munroe and John A. Kimball were licensed as retailers of liquors.

April 7, 1823, Isaac Fuller was allowed \$5.00 for placing plank on the edge of the river at his ferry to make it safe passing at this season of the year.

September 8, voted to assess \$300.00 upon district number 7, to build a school-house.

April 3, 1826, this meeting was held at the Baptist meeting-house instead of the Methodist, the usual place of meeting, and voted that the September meeting be held at the Baptist meeting-house.

March 6, 1827, voted to give the Methodists \$6.00 a year for the use of their house for town meetings.

March 1, 1883, the \$200.00 (interest from the ministerial fund) was divided. The Universalist Society (west side) received \$45.00, Universalist (east side) \$23.66; First Baptist, \$36.65; Second Baptist, \$7.42; Third Baptist, \$25.52; Methodist, (west side) \$26.91; Methodist (east side), \$21.34; Freewill Baptist, \$9.74; Elder Hayes, \$3.72.

March 24, voted to receive the public money and to apply it in payment for the farm recently purchased.

September 14, 1840, voted not to divide the town.

In 1843 on the sixth day of March the town of Livermore voted to divide the town and consented to the incorporation of East Livermore. On the twentieth of March of this same year an act passed the Legislature at Augusta to incorporate "All that part of the town of Livermore in the county of Oxford on the east side of the Androscoggin river, into a town by the name of East Livermore. This division was made on account of the inconvenience of holding town meetings and doing other town business when the river was not covered by a bridge. The larger part of the population was in those days in Livermore as now known, and it was often impossible for people in East Livermore to attend a town meeting in March on account of the freshets, and the policy of the town was determined almost wholly by the people of the western part.

The people of the eastern portion for many years called for a bridge, but were not given one. They finally petitioned the Legislature for a division of the town, and the above mentioned act is the result obtained.

The first officers chosen in the new towd of East Livermore were as follows: A. Barton, clerk; A. Barton, D. Benjamin and J. Ford, selectmen.

### **Military Matters**

The military record of Livermore and East Livermore is a source of just pride to the citizens of these

two towns. As we scan the list of the names of the early settlers we find that there is scarcely a name that does not carry with it a record for service in the Revolution. And it is not too much to say that this spirit of loyalty has continued to the present day in a marked degree. We have concluded to quote the following extract from a previous writer in regard to the military affairs of the old town of Livermore in the early days as it covers the ground and is presumably accurate.

Major Thomas Fish, Josiah Wyer, Lieut., Samuel Benjamin, John Walker, Abial Turner, Elisha Fisher, Lieut., Samuel Foster, Major Joseph Mills and others of the settlers did honorable service in the Revolution before the settlement of Livermore was made, and the martial spirit was soon shown by the formation of militia companies. The first was formed in 1800 and had David Learned for captain. He was later major; William Coolidge, Lieut; Henry Sawtelle, ensign. In 1803 two companies were organized from this one. The one at North Livermore was commanded by Captain Jesse Stone, Lieut., Jacob Gibbs, Ensign Thomas Chase Jr.; that at East Livermore by Captain Peter Haines, Lieut., Robert Morrison; ensign, Theodore Marston. A company was soon formed in South Livermore, Captain, Henry Sawtelle; Lieut., James Starbird; ensign, Joseph Mills. A cavalry troop was formed in 1809, principally in Livermore, but with men from Turner, Jay and Dixfield. Officers: Captain Samuel Atwood, Lieut., Isaac Talbot, (Turner),

Cornet, Aaron S. Barton (Dixfield). This was a crack company of the section for years. Among the later captains were Simeon Waters, Daniel and Elisha Coolidge, Alpheus Kendall, Isaac and Hastings Strickland, Otis Pray, M. M. Stone, Hezekiah Atwood, Rufus Hewett. War of 1812.—Two companies of the militia served at Portland. They were commanded by Captain Elias Morse and Ensign, Henry Aldrich and Captain William Marston and Lieut., Thomas Davis. The regimental officers from Livermore were: Joshua Soule, chaplain; James Chase, adjutant; Henry Wood, quartermaster; John Briggs, paymaster; Cornelius Holland, surgeon. A large number from Livermore served in the regular army in this war.

In the Civil War Livermore contributed her full quotas of volunteers, ninety-four in all, made generous provision for the families of her absent soldiers, and cheerfully payed all liabilities incurred on account of the war.

The town of East Livermore when it separated itself from the old town of Livermore it carried with it its proportional share of the property, thrift and prosperity. In no less degree did it share the loyalty and patriotism. When the dark clouds of secession covered the land and finally burst forth into bitter, fearful civil war this town sent forth from its firesides a large number of its fathers, sons, brothers, many of them never to return, to combat the enemies of the Federal Government.

## BAPTIST CHURCH

The Baptist Church at Livermore Falls was organized on November 20, 1811, under the name of the The Third Baptist Church in Livermore. The first members were Rev., Thomas Wyman, Zephaniah Bumpus, Jesse Smith, Ebenezer Turner, Ithamar Farrington, Theodore Martin, Levi Pike, Nancy Whittemore, Sally Bassett, Mary Lyford, Hannah Pike, Irene Smith, Mary Bumpus, Sarah Smith, Polly Turner, Elizabeth Farrington, Mary Baker, Jerusha Lyford, Sally Marston, Ebenezer Farrington, John Wyman, Cushman Bassett, Jonathan Libby, Ebenezer Whittemore, Betsey Smith.

The home of this church was in school-houses and private dwellings till 1825 when a church was erected at Shy corner near the present cemetery. This church was moved to the village in 1854. It continued to be the house of worship for this denomination till 1871 when it was torn down to give place to the present structure.

## UNIVERSALIST

The history of the Universalist Society in East Livermore begins in 1861, properly speaking; but prior to this time there had been occasional meetings held at Haine's Corner, and in school-houses and in Treat's Hall. In 1860 a church was built through the efforts of Abram Luce, Orrin Luce, Comfort Pettingill Cyrns Morrison, Nathaniel Mayo and Ezekiel Treat. It was through the financial aid given by these men that the project was carried out. Some of the preachers of this denomination prior to 1861 were, George Bates, Thomas Dolloff, Ezekiel Vose, Robert Blacker, George Quimby, O. H. Johnson. In 1861 the Universalist Society was organized under the name of "The First Universalist Parish Church."

#### METHODIST

Methodism in this region like so many other places in Maine got impetus from the work of Jesse Lee, the

father of this denomination in the State of Maine. Mr. Lee preached the first Methodist sermon in the old Fayette circuit at Fayette Corner on February 11, 1794. The whole of this section continued for many years to be part of the Readfield charge. In 1827 classes were formed at East Livermore, and at Livermore Falls, as well as at other points in this section. The leader of the East Livermore class was Isaac Billington, and of the Falls class William Snow.

About 1830 at Haines' Corner there was erected a house of worship which continued till 1844 to be the home of this society. The year 1845 witnessed the removal of a meeting house from Fayette Corner to this point. This house has been used by the Methodists till the present time.

The Methodist Church at Livermore Falls was organized May 15, 1866 with eighty-six members. The meetings were at first held in a Hall (Lothrop's), but the year 1869 saw the erection of a house of worship on Church street. This society built a parsonage in the year 1888.

### METHODIST

The Methodist Church of the town of Livermore was organized by Jesse Lee. It was started in the

form of a class organized in 1795. The first sermon of this faith was preached by Mr. Lee on February 12, 1793 from the text, "For if ye live after the flesh ye shall die" (Romans VIII:13).

Phillip Wager preached the second sermon in 1795; John Soule organized the first regular church society. Some early members were Deacon Livermore, wife, and daughter; Samuel Hillman, Jacob Haskell, wife and later all their children, Orin Haskell, Samuel Livermore, Simeon Howard, John Richardson and wife, Mrs. E. Chenery, Nathaniel Perley and wife, Abel, John and Robert Hayes, Abel and John Monroe, Capt. Baker, Thomas Chase Jr., P. Hewitt and Samuel Boothby.

## FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

The First Baptist Church in Livermore was organized August 7, 1793, with the following members: Daniel Holman, Peletiah Gibbs, Isaac Lovewell, Elisha Williams, Otis Robinson, Henry Bond, James Delano, Zebedee Delano, Thomas Wyman, Peter Goding, David Reed, Anna Gibbs, Hannah Robinson, Mary Delano, Susana Wyman, Grace Delano, Catherine Walker. The first religious worship in the new community was in the household of Zebedee Delano where services were held prior to any effort being made to organize a church society. The society when organized was without a pastor and remained so for about one decade. The first pastor was Rev. S. Boardman, the father of George Dana Boardman, the famous missionary, and he began his pastorate here in 1802. Some of his successors have been the following: John Haynes, 1811; David Nutter, 1824; R. ## SECOND BAPTIST CHURCH

The Second Baptist Church in the south part of Livermore, was organized in 1811 with seventeen

members. The first pastor was Rev. Ransom Norton. The first church edifice was erected in 1819. This structure was taken down and was put up about half a mile north of North Turner bridge.

The pastors have been: W. Foss and Martin Leonard who supplied from 1826 to 1838; William Johnson, 1838; Joseph Hutchinson, 1840; Samuel Boothby, 1842; Levi Burnham, 1848; Nathan Mayhew 1850; R. C. This society was organized at North Livermore in 1871 with twenty-seven members, and the former residence of Colonel Stone was remodelled into a church. In 1877 a chapel was built at Livermore village, and the following year the church at Livermore Center was repaired and reoccupied.

#### UNIVERSALIST

The Universalist Church in Livermore was organized in 1807. The church building was completed in 1829 at the Norlands. A new church was erected at the village in 1869. #### ADVENT SOCIETY

The Adventist Society was organized at this place in 1858 with forty-four members. The membership is now twenty-five. The society erected a neat chapel at the cost of about \$600. The trustees of this organization are Frank P. Hiscock, Chandler Dennen and F. Boothby. The pastors have been Jesse Gay, Charles W. Shattuck, J. A. Libby, and Daniel Kilbreth.

### **Manufacturing**

Manufacturing has ever prospered within the borders of the two Livermores. Situated on either side of the Androscoggin river and in a section of the valley where good water powers are numerous, they have been favored. The leading industries for many years, in these two towns, like all others in early years, centered in the saw mill and grist mill. These were absolutely necessary and were provided at the earliest possible date. From these mills as a nucleus the large manufacturing interests of the towns have sprung up, the former at South Livermore and the latter at Bret-



tun's. Among Mr. Livermore's successors in the mill at Brettun's are the following: Capt. Henry Sawtelle, Nezar Dailey and W. H. Brettuns, for whom the place came to be named. Ozias Bartlett erected a carding mill about 1870, the Sole Shoe Factory Co. opened a shoe factory here and S. V. Young also ran a factory employing about 25 people, making, with the Soule concern's employes. about 125 to 140. About 1875 there was the Russell Brothers' steam mill, which turned out a product of boxes and spools. Business continued to prosper through the greater part of the decade of the 80's, till the burning of Piper's novelty mill, in 1888.

In the north part there has been but one mill, a saw mill. The early mills in the north part of the original town were on the east side, but with the coming of the large industrial prosperity which has dawned upon this portion of the town the west side of the river began to boom, and today there are several important industries at this point.

As early as 1830 Mr. F. F. Harris operated a large hemp mill at this point. At the Falls there was a saw and grist mill built by Elijah Livermore not far from 1791. It was stated that when the mills were completed there was a great jubilee among the delighted population.

Though there are small powers at different points in the town, the chief power is at the Falls, and it is here that the greater portion of the development is be-

ing made. Here the Androscoggin has a natural fall of 22 feet in 30 rods. The valley is well adapted to the location of manufacturing plants. In 1882 the Umbagog Pulp Company was incorporated with a capital of \$150,000, which was later enlarged. They built up a large mill on the west side, though the company owned property on both sides of the river. This concern has since become a part of the International Paper Company, and this, together with the Otis mill at Otis Falls, where Oliver Otis once owned and operated a saw mill, and the Falmouth mill at Jay Bridge, all under the superintendence of Mr. Edwin Riley, makes a very important industry. Several hundred men are employed and the town is receiving, daily and hourly, great benefit from this source. Mr. Riley is a very public spirited man and has taken an active part in the promotion of Livermore Falls. To him much credit for the progressiveness of the town is due.

Another important industry that has been located at Livermore Falls for many years is the foundry business of J. A. Record, now owned by the Record Foundry and Machine Company. It was incorporated and began business on August 1, 1902. The capital stock is \$50,000. This plant is located on upper Main street and is doing a general foundry and machine business. It also makes a specialty of supplies of pulleys and heavy machinery for all kinds of mills. The president of the company is Edwin Riley, the secretary and treasurer is C. H. Sturtevant. And the manager is J. A. Record.

The Richmond Manufacturing Company is one of Livermore Falls' new industries. This concern was recently organized, the date being October 28, 1903. The concern is to build a mill 125 feet long and 44 feet wide, two stories high, on the Flat, on the land of the Livermore Falls Light and Power Company. This concern will manufacture boxes and do a general novelty work. The capital stock is \$50,000. About 200 hands will be employed. The superintendent of this plant is to be F. S. Richmond. The president of the concern is Edwin Riley, the secretary and treasurer is John H. Maxwell.

Among other industries are Allen's Machine Works, Gordon Brothers' and A. M. Bumpus's saw mills, Chandler's grist mill, Dana W. Bailey's carriage manufactory on Depot street, and the New England Creamery Company, and many smaller ones which combine to make Livermore Falls one of the leading manufacturing villages of the Androscoggin valley.

### **Mercantile**

The first merchant of Livermore was Gen. David Learned, who was in business a little to the south of the Norlands. His successor was Artemas Leonard of Raynham, Mass. Israel Washburn succeeded

Leonard, and did business until 1829. A. T. Bryant & Co. and W. F. Fuller were later merchants here.

The first recorded merchant in East Livermore, about the Falls, was one Mills, who was here as early as 1815. He was followed at long intervals by the following: Samuel Morrison, Samuel F. Fuller, Francis Fuller, E. Pettingill, Mr. Stone, Mr. Waterman, Mr. Cooper, Mr. Cutler, Mr. Mayo, Mr. Kimball, C. Pettin-gill, Mr. Noyes, Mr. Reed, and Mr. Chandler.

Jeffers, G. F. Wood, E. S. Goding, E. & H. Sewall and M. E. Whitcomb. There are some others whose names we are unable to give.

## Professional Men

The town of Livermore has ever been well known for the men of ability that she has given to the State and Nation. A previous writer says that forty years ago the town of Livermore could have furnished enough well qualified men to fill all the state offices of Maine. Among the number were the following: Ruel Washburn, Ulmer Perley, Tristram Hillman,

Warren Bigelow, John Monroe, Nathaniel Perley, Clarendon Waters, James Chase, Hezekiah Atwood, Isaac Strickland, and Lee Strickland. More than a hundred teachers have gone out from this town to win honor for themselves and the town. The following is a list of men she has sent to fields renown: Two ministers to foreign countries, one secretary of state, one United States Senator, four members of Congress, two governors, two Judges of Probate, and two Generals in the Civil War.

#### LAWYERS

The first lawyer to practice in East Livermore was William A. Evans, a brother of United States Senator Evans. He came here about 1840, but later removed to Fort Fairfield. He was succeeded by Grove Catlin, who came here in 1854 from York County. Mr. Catlin was a farmer at Otis Falls as well as an attorney. He removed to New Hampshire about 1865. The year 1858 brought H. C. Wentworth to this place. He was a native of Readfield. Mr. Wentworth was a man of excellent attainments. He remained here till 1870 when he removed to Auburn. A. C. Otis came from Winthrop in 1873 but remained only two years. The remaining lawyers on East Livermore's list are as follows: Cyrus Knapp, H. C. Whittemore, William A. French, John H. Maxwell, R. S. Higgins, B. Emery Pratt, L. O. Rieutord, N. G. Foster and John Merriman.

The town of Livermore has not had an unusually large number of lawyers. The first in this town was a Mr. Strong. He was succeeded by Jonathan G. Hunton, who afterwards became Governor of the State. Others have been Ezra Kingman, Asa King, Harry Wood, and Richard Belcher. These constitute the list of the earliest ones. Reuel Washburn, Seth D. Washburn and Barzillai Streeter were among the others of this town.

However Livermore has sent out to other fields a large number of lawyers. The number is twenty-seven according to the figures of a previous writer. The names follow. Isreal Washburn, Elihu B. Washburn, Cadwallader C. Washburn, Charles Washburn, Ganem Washburn, Seth D. Washburn, William D. Washburn, William Stone, Nathaniel Haynes, Ransom Norton, John N. #### PHYSICIANS

The town of Livermore has had the following physicians: Cyrus Hamlin, who came here about 1795 and on account of the people of the place not being numerous enough to guarantee him a practice large

enough to support him, they promised him that he and his horse should be taken care of gratuitously, and like the country school teacher of that day, he boarded round. Hon. Hannibal Hamlin, United States Senator and Vice President of the United States, was a son of Dr. Hamlin. Dr. Cornelius Holland practiced here a few years. Others have been Dr. Benjamin Prescott, 1805; Dr. Benjamin Bradford, 1809; Timothy Hoe, 1814, whose son, Timothy O. Howe, became a United States Senator, Postmaster General under President Arthur, and held other offices of large trust. Drs. S. B. Morrison, Barnard, William Drown, Albert L. Frye, J. W. Bridgham, John Ladd, I. C. Dunham, Adams, Eli Edgecomb, H. A. Smith, C. H. Leverton, and C. E. Knight are others.

### General Survey

In a general survey of these two towns, now but beginning their days of prosperity, and with a fair prospect of some day turning out the finished product of a city from the beginnings now being undertaken, there are many things to be said. Among the things that have been deplored most in the past few years are the fires that have visited the village of Livermore Falls. These two fires were very disasterous to the place, yet the village has apparently recovered from the loss, and with the new blocks she has built look far better than of old.

The date of the first fire was September 10, 1898, and it was started on Depot street and ran along this

street as far as the hotel which it partially destroyed. This was a severe fire, the loss being not far from \$160,000. The second fire occurred on June 21, 1899, and started in a barn on the west of Main street near the M. C. R. R. track at about midnight, and soon caught on the stores on the west side of Main street and ran down the street very rapidly taking everything in its wake. The fire department struggled manfully but could not successfully combat it. The loss was estimated at \$100,000 to \$150,000.

Among the things of great interest to the stranger and to all in fact who know about it is the lense grinding machine of D. S. Thompson, the Livermore Falls Jeweller and Optician. This is Mr. Thompson's own invention, and is pronounced by the experts in this profession to be one of the greatest inventions of the age in this department of science. The machine is called "The Thompson Automatic Surface Grinding Lathe."

The first machine of this kind was built by Mr. Thompson, who by the way does all the drafting for the different parts of this complicated and most carefully constructed machine, in 1897. The last one was constructed in 1902 and is in operation in his optical rooms at Livermore Falls. On this machine more work can be done than on a large number of any others on the market today. The accuracy of its work, and large size of its product combine to make it a most practical and valuable invention as well as wonderfully ingen-

ious. Mr. Thompson has been offered and has refused the price of \$10,000 and a royalty of \$10.00 on each machine sold.

### THE NORLANDS

Another object of much interest because of the famous men and women who have been reared near by, as well as because of its wonderful beauty is "The Norlands" the far-famed Washburn Homestead in Livermore. No attempt will be made to describe on account of necessary brevity.

The Washburn Memorial Library was dedicated at the Norlands August 27, 1884. Its cost was about \$10,000, its size, 32x48 feet, and was constructed of Hallowell granite. It is the gift of Hon. I. B. and W. D. Washburn in honor of their father and mother. It is beautifully furnished throughout and is a place of most historical note in the Androscoggin valley.

## Educational Account

The educational facilities of Livermore have always received their full share of attention at the hands of her citizens. From the very earliest years there has been a combined effort to do something each year to advance and promote the cause of education in these two towns.

At the first town meeting in the old town of Livermore a vote was taken to raise £40 for the support of schools. Constant attention from this time was given and in 1801 \$900 was voted to build school houses in all the districts. These were to be "not less than 26x20 and 8 feet stud with a hipped roof with a 6 feet ridge-pole." For years the school teachers were obliged to work for small pay as was the case in other towns, but the results produced were most excellent. The men and women who have attained success in other states as well as in our own who were given their early training in the schools of Livermore are a standing guarantee of the efficiency of these early institutions. The present day schools are aiming to concentration to a large degree. The High School at Livermore Falls is the most prominent part of the school system of these towns.

This institution is of recent growth. In the last decade of the past century more concerted effort was made to build up the High School. Prof. J. M. Pike

is one to whom much credit is due, though all citizens have taken a very creditable part in the promotion of the school. When a town of the size of East Livermore builds a school building at a cost of \$20,000 and equips it thoroughly, and supports it loyally, there is little to be feared for any backward steps on the part of that town. This is what East Livermore did in 1900.

Since 1897 the number of students has increased in the High School from sixteen to eighty-five, and the teachers from one to four.

The school officials are as follows: John H. Maxwell, Esq., chairman; C. R. Smith and H. A. Morrison, school board; J. M. Pike, superintendent. The board of instruction is as follows: J. M. Pike, principal; Etta F. Purington, Latin and Mathematics; Mildred A. Whittimore, French, Latin and History; Lizzie M. Russell, Elocution and Physical Culture.

This school, with its different departments so well equipped, bids fair to be one of the leading institutions of its class in the county.

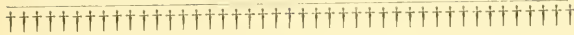

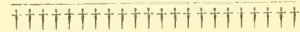

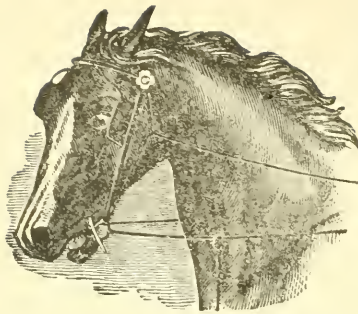
